Hon. George Meader, House of Representatives, West Coast Congressman, has written a letter to your communications of June 26, 1955, transmitting letters from Mrs. Florence Field, Marshall H. Page and a petition signed by a number of citizens regarding the discontinuance of star route No. 2712, Naperville to Manchester, Michigan. An investigation of the route being performed since July 1, 1955, has been made and report submitted to the Post Office Department on August 3, 1955. The investigation discloses that there was very little change made to star route No. 2712, Jackson to Adrian, Michigan, since July 1 of this year. The route was discontinued after July 31, 1955.

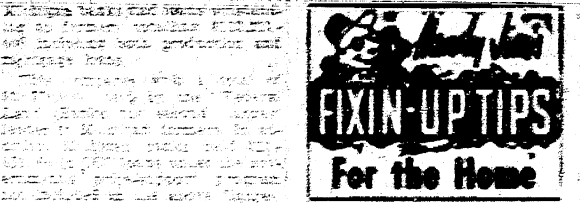

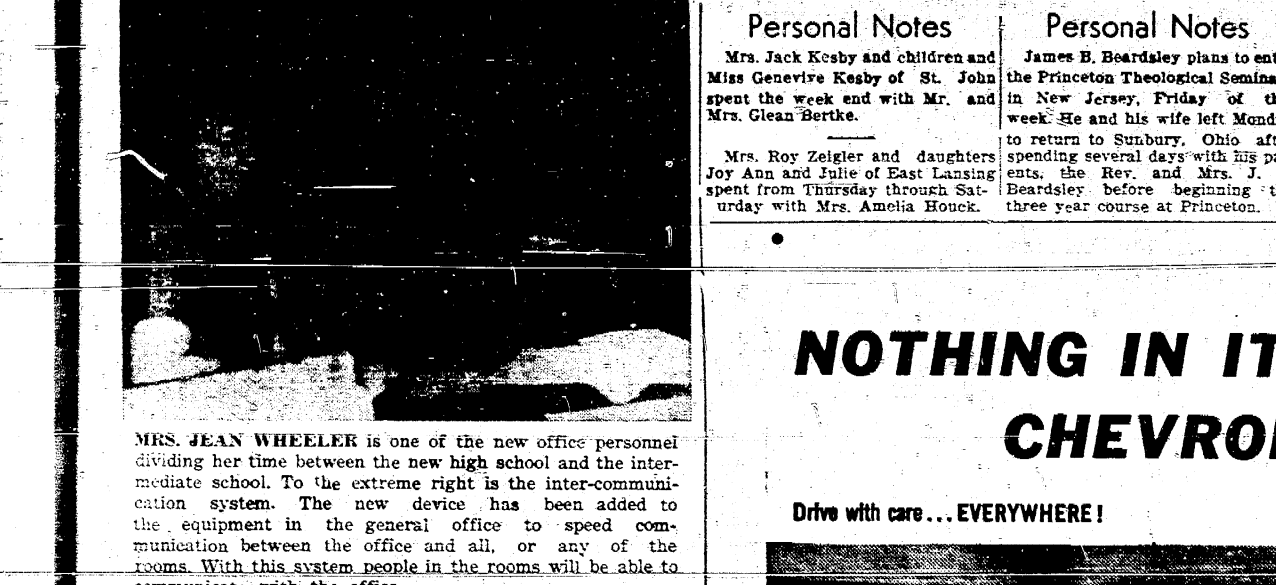

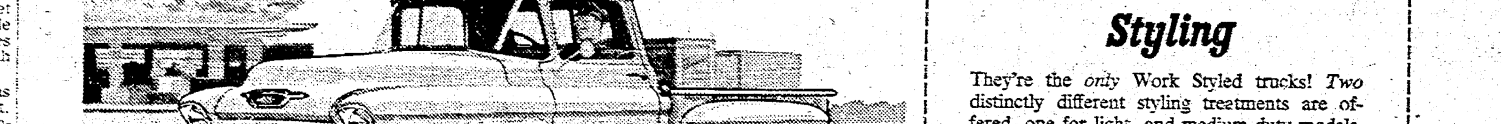
