

Farm Problem Will Face 84th Congress; Relief Seen

The major domestic problem facing the second session of the state of the second sessional aisses agree that some thing must be done-but there the agreement seems to end.

Last year, most Democrats and several farm-helt Republicans, contended that the current cost-price squeeze could be relieved only by a return to the 90 per cent support level on the six basic crops-wheat, corn, peanuts, tobacco rice and cotton.

There is still considerable sentiment for this solution-included in the farm bill passed in 1955 by the House and now before the Senate Agriculture Committee.

The administration vigorously disagrees, and argues that such a step would only compound the crisis by piling up ever more surpluses now jamming warehouses over the country.

Agriculture Secretary Ezra Taft Benson has declared that as long as he is the administration's chief farm policy strategist, flexible rather than rigid supports will prevail.
