Ways To Up Dairy Farm Income

A Michigan State University farm economist believes there are ways for the individual dairy farmer to boost his income starting right a home.

Glenn McBride says there may be some adjustments in the dairy farm business that will return more income at a little added expense.

First, high producing cows bring in more income. Returns over a feed cost increase as production increases.

Second, cows that are dry from six to eight weeks send in profit from the most milk during dry periods not enough to pay for the extra feed.

Third, uniform production brings more income. Most dairymen have high production during the flush months. Freshening periods should be timed to even out production.

With cows performing well, you are using your own labor. McBride suggests, changes in the chore system or adjusting the size of the operation to make the best use of labor could result in greater profit.

McBride says the final decision on making these adjustments should be based on the expected returns and expense curve.

Any new agreement between the present six months agreement and the new one should reflect this change at least as a minimum price.

Want to sell that old jolopy, or that late model sedan or coupe? There's more to it than running a classified ad in your newspaper, it seems.

"Today's used car buyer is more discriminating than ever before in his personal of the car in question," says S. P. Hutchins, used vehicle sales manager for Dodge.

"Clear cars move, whether they are sold through a newspaper ad or as a trade-in on a new model," he adds. "Cars that lack appearance and conditioning have a way of growing older - older - and older."

As an aid to the car owner who plans soon to sell his automobile, Hutchins offers the following "do-it-yourself" suggestions for preparing the car for sale to get the top dollar. Materials are available from your dealer's service department.

INTERIOR - A clean, reconditioned car interior will capture the interest of the used car buyer and increase his desire to buy, says Hutchins.

Upholstery cleaner restores the color and faded fabric or their upholstery. After cleaning, follow with an application of upholstery preservative or wax to protect the fabric from dry rot and staining.

To further improve the appearance of the car, replace floor mats or recondition old ones with patches and black rubber linings.

EXTERIOR - For a more saleable car, all body metal should be repaired in a service shop and the entire exterior then cleaned and polished.

The color and beauty of the original paint job can be revived by retouching and faded fabric or their upholstery.

To restore lustre to chromium, copper and nickel trim, Hutchins suggests the application of liquid chrome polish, followed with an application of wax-type chrome protector. This treatment will remove surface rust, corrosion and tarnish, leaving a durable, radiant coating for lasting protection against deterioration.

Tires should receive special attention too. Special chemicals are available for renewing the appearance of both white wall and black tires.

U.M. Offers 100 Courses To Study Right At Home

High school and college students who plan to complete home study courses offered by The University of Michigan during summer vacation should enroll as soon as possible, according to Mrs. Alfred O. Lee, supervisor of the U.M. Extension Service correspondence department.

Students who enroll before the end of the current semester should be able to procure their supplies and be ready to start on their home study work early in June, Mrs. Lee says.

More than 30 high school courses are available through the University's correspondence study department. Many high school students use them to make up requirements for graduation or college entrance, especially during vacation months.

During the year many of the state's smaller high schools enroll while "classes" in subjects not offered in the school curriculum.

Approximately 60 courses which offer college credits are also available. Such credit may be used in the University's College of Letters, Science and the Arts, the School of Business Administration, the School of Education, and the College of Engineering.

Up to 15 hours of college credit earned through correspondence study may be applied toward a degree. Those in the services may earn as much as 30 hours toward a degree.
