## Union And Peoples Banks Merged And Operating In Union Bank Quarters

With the unanimous affirmative vote of the shareholders of both banks in the record books, plus the approval of both State Banking Commission and the Federal Reserve officials, the officers of the two banks lost no time to effect the consolidation and center the activities of the newly formed bank in modern and efficient offices of the Union Savings Bank.

The officers of the consolidated bank are: Bennett Root, chairman of the board; James Hendry, president; Dan Bottell, executive vice president and cashier; Frank Tibb, Carl Wuerthner, G. William Kramer and Fred Lehman, vice presidents; LeRoy Marks, Ed King and Harold Burch, assistant cashiers.

Four thousand five hundred and twelve shares of Union bank stock were voted in favor of the merger. Two hundred and forty four shares of Peoples stock were voted.

The vote for the merger was unanimous at the meetings of both banks shareholders.

## P. Lake Straw Vote OK's Merger

One hundred-seventy-five persons gathered at the Pleasant Lake school Monday afternoon for a straw vote taken on the question of whether or not to build a new school for the 45 students in that school for the year 1956-57.

Prior to the meeting the school board personally called on the people in the area and explained the situation to the voters and distributed printed material explaining the proposed annexation or merger.

People not able to attend the meeting met in their homes. There were 283 surveying to Manchester and 77 voting to build a school. The next step will be from the State Attorney's office where plans will be made to hold a legal vote on the annexation procedure.

Manchester voters will also cast their ballot on the proposed annexation.

The Pleasant Lake school district had applied the possibility of annexing to the Union Savings Bank before the Union Savings Bank but their proposals did not receive the approval of either of the school districts. The distance and other factors including expanding programs.

Joining the two districts would mean that each district would assume the debts of the other district. Pleasant Lake school tax last year were 8,278 mills on the state equalization; of this amount 3,278 mills were for a debt contracted in 1952 and planned to be paid off in 1971.

Manchester's debt for the elementary school, which was planned to be paid in 1958 was paid in full this year. A debt contracted in February, 1954 to run through 1971 exists. Manchester's tax millage on equalization valuation last year was 17.2.

If the voters approved the proposed plan joining the two districts, high school students will come into town from Pleasant Lake and possibly some of the children in the outlying districts may go to Pleasant Lake school. A legal vote will be taken.

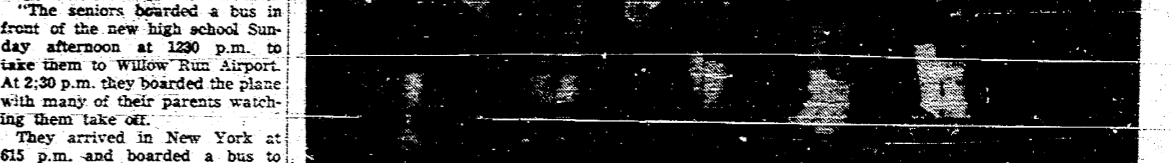

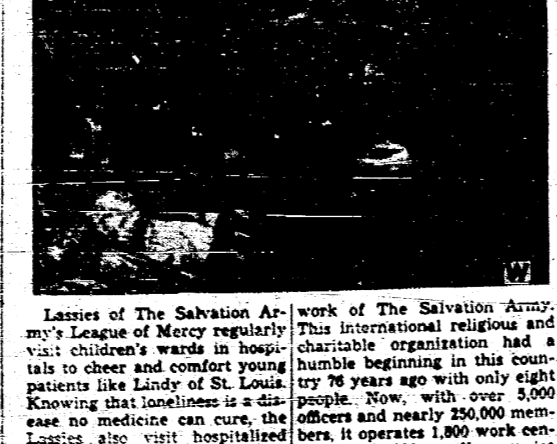
