Mrs. Livernois can remember back to some of the interesting events recounted in the old document and knows of others handed down by word of mouth in the family for generations.

Livernois St. in Detroit was named for the family which owned the farm at the southeast corner of the Michigan intersection.

First listed member of the family was Etienne Livernois who married Anne Angélique Pelletier in Detroit.

Among their children was Joseph Livernois whose son Joseph was killed by Indians June 1, 1824 at the Fort Miami village on the Huron River. His remains were returned to Detroit for burial on his grandfather's farm.

The Mill Theatre: A Segment Of Saline's Fascinating History

Of all the hundreds of summer theaters on the Straw-Hat Circuit, it is unlikely that any have had as dramatic a past as the Saline Mill Theater, located a few steps off historic Old Route 112. It is equally unlikely that any of the playhouses whose works are presented here each summer could have dreamed up a setting as rich in history as the Mill itself.

This will seem logical when it is remembered that the present Route 112 was not so long ago, the Old Chicago Pike, one of the most vital links between the civilized east and the wilds of the midwest.

Before that the path was known as the "Sank Thee" road, by Indian, pioneer, and settler alike. Its origins reach far back into the annals of time.

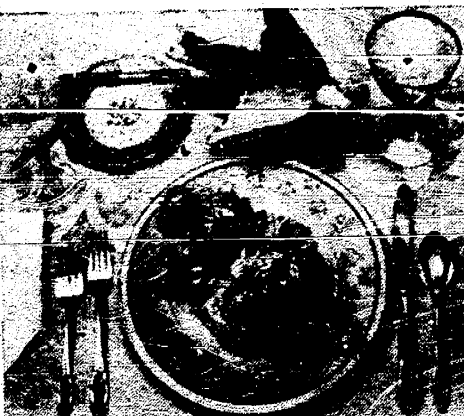

Lower Farm Output Ahead

The Agriculture Department's crop reporting board points out that crop prospects as of June 1 are "less optimistic" than this time a year ago.

The board said yesterday that much needed rains brightened the future for large acreages of corn, cotton, soybeans, sorghum and other crops. It added that many sections of the nation had insufficient rain and "badly need more soil moisture."

Frosts in many northern sections reduced some fruit crops. Warmer weather, said the board, is "generally needed to promote normal plant growth over much of the nation," especially over the central half.

It forecast the 1956 winter wheat crop at 670 million bushels, two per cent less than last month's estimates, chiefly because of additional acreage abandonment in the central and great plains states, and in Montana.

The acreage cut more than offset high yields in Texas and Oklahoma and in states east of the Mississippi River.

The board also said that a spring wheat crop of about 222 million bushels now seems probable. It would top last year's small crop by about eight per cent. The board said by adding spring wheat to the winter wheat crop, an all-wheat crop of nearly 922 million bushels or two per cent below last year's, is indicated.

The board emphasized that the "all crops" prospects on June 1 are less favorable than usual at this date, reflecting the prevailing slowness of crop progress.

It added that for the nation, these overall appraisals of crop prospects are the lowest for the date since 1945.

The report said corn planting was nearly completed in the West. Commercially-prepared sprays or dusts may be used, but sprays are preferred, he said.

About 15 airplanes will take part in the Agriculture Department's "biggest aerial insect blitz" between now and August in New England and the Midwest.

Higher Prices Coming For Cars, Shoes, Men's Clothing In Fall

Consumers can expect higher prices on auto, shoes and men's clothing in the fall, according to a survey by the National Bureau of Economic Research.

Merchants and dealers who say that consumers always buy their clothing at the markdown sales at the end of the season. They know that the auto factory's list price is only the point at which the bargaining begins. But they also know that many people will pay the higher prices next fall because they want to be the first to have the new styles, the new models.

As far as cars: In a sense this fall's boom, if it comes, will be the result of the inflation of the 1940's still catching up. 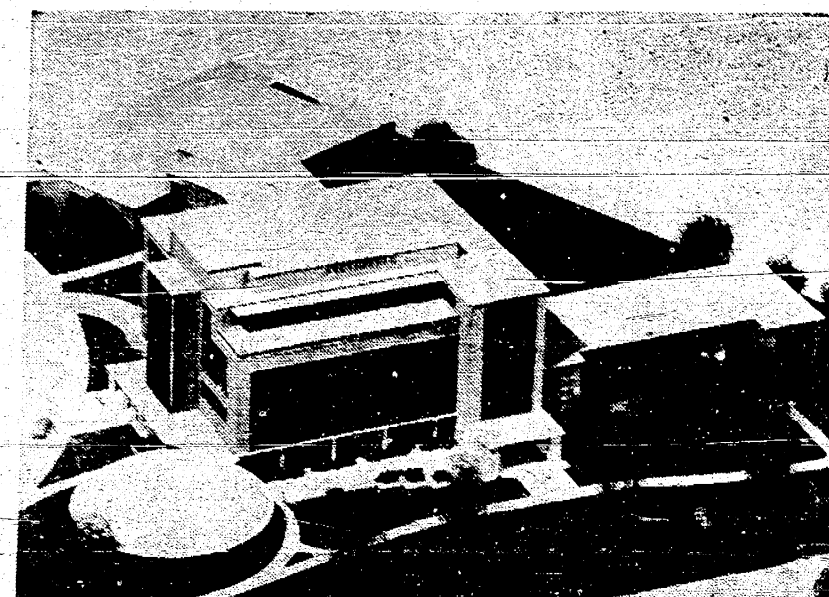
