The big question facing dairy farmers today is: How can 1 make a reasonable net profit in the face of mounting surpluses and low market prices?

There are three ways to approach this problem, suggests the Agricultural Service Division of Better breeding, better management, better breeding practices.

Among the considerations of better breeding—saide from inheritance—are these cows well produce more total milk for a year if they freshen in the Fall rather than in the Spring; betters should be bred by weight—not age. Bossie should be given about a 60-day rest between lactations.

Better management is a second answer: A good environment for the most profitable milk production. Commercial supplements when the spring that a stalls are large enough; cover the floor with a heavy layer of clean bedding—when cows are forced to lie on concrete, mastitis often results.

Another cause of mastitis is injury caused by high door sills or slipping on wet slick barn floors.

Good farmers know, too, that cows should be treated gently—capecially the young hetters—at milking time. Stop the milking machine immediately after the milk flow is ended; keep milking
