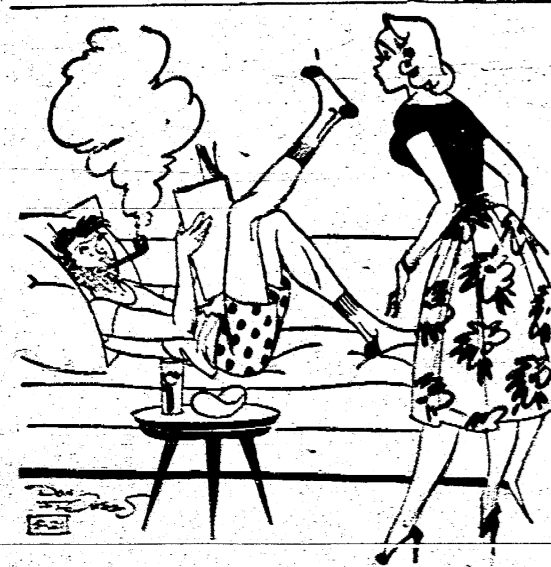

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION OF THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF MANCHESTER PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT, WASHINGTON AND JACKSON COUNTIES, MICH., TO BE HELD:

JULY 25, 1956

To The Qualified Electors of Said School District:

Please Take Notice that a special election of the qualified electors of said school district will be held in the main room of the Manchester High School on the 25th day of July, 1956.

THE POLLS OF ELECTION WILL OPEN AT 1:00 O'CLOCK P.M. AND CLOSE AT 5:00 O'CLOCK P.M. EASTERN STANDARD TIME.

The following propositions will be submitted to the vote of the electors qualified to vote thereon at said special election:

- I. Shall the limitation on the total amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Manchester Public School Dist., Washington & Jackson Co., Mich., for all purposes, except taxes levied for payment of interest, be increased to 2.50% (two and one-half per cent) on the assessed value of the assessed valuation, as constituted of all property in the School District for a period of sixteen (16) years, from 1956 to 1971, both inclusive, for the purpose of providing debt retirement funds for the outstanding bond issue of Pleasant Lake School District, Washtenaw County, Michigan.
- II. Shall Manchester Public School District, Washington and Jackson Counties, Michigan, assume its pro-rata share of the bonded indebtedness of Pleasant Lake School District, Washtenaw County, Mich.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE THAT THE ANNEXATION OF PLEASANT LAKE SCHOOL DISTRICT WILL NOT BECOME EFFECTIVE UNLESS:

1. The electors of Pleasant Lake School District, by majority vote, approve the annexation of Pleasant Lake School District to this District, approve the assumption of its pro-rata share of the bonded indebtedness, and approve an increase in the constitutional tax limitation thereon, AND
2. Propositions I and II receive affirmative majority votes in this election.

Each person voting on the proposition of increasing the total tax rate limitation must be a citizen of the United States, above the age of 21 years, and have resided in the State of Michigan six months, and in the School District 30 days next preceding the election.

Each person voting on the proposition of this District assuming its pro-rata share of the bonded indebtedness of Pleasant Lake School District must be a citizen of the United States, above the age of 21 years, and have resided in the State of Michigan six months, and in the School District 30 days next preceding the election, and must have property assessed for taxes within the School District or be the lawful husband or wife of a qualified voter of the District having property so assessed.

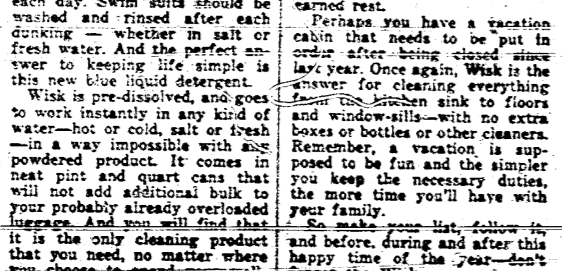

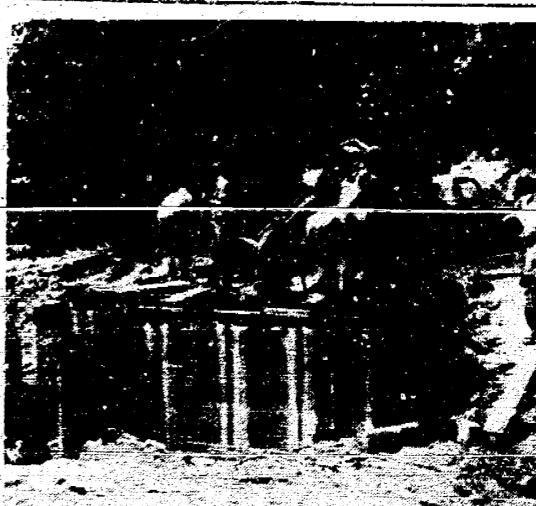
