Facts About The Michigan Conservation Program

1. What is the purpose of the Conservation Reserve Program?
As a part of the Soil Bank and companion to the Acreage Reserve program, the Conservation Reserve is a long-term program designed to reduce the volume of crop production by assisting producers in establishing vegetative cover on erodible cropland, and to conserve water and soil on cropland.

2. What type assistance is available?
The Secretary of Agriculture will enter into contracts with producers to share the costs of establishing approved conservation practices on the designated acreage of the conservation reserve, and to make annual payments to such producers for maintaining the conservation uses for the term of the contract.

3. Who is eligible to participate?
Any farmer who owns or controls land which is erodible or which is in need of water conservation practices, and who is a resident of Michigan, is eligible to participate in the program.

4. What is the intended effect of the program?
For Michigan, in 1956 from 100,000 to 200,000 acres, or about 6 per cent of the total cropland, will be placed in the Conservation Reserve.

5. Can a farmer get Conservation Reserve payments on land already in the Conservation Reserve?
No. However, ACR payments are available for any land on his farm.

6. Where a third to the acreage farm allowed in the Conservation Reserve.
There is no maximum limit, except that a farmer may receive payment for more than 83,000 acres, a maximum of 5 acres of cropland, and a maximum of 2 acres of pasture.

7. Who signs the contract?

Enter \$115,000 Model Car Makers Contest; Ends June '57

Eighteen university scholarships worth \$55,000 and another \$77,000 in cash and other awards are the stakes in the 1957 Dodge 184000 Craftsman's Guild model car competition.

1956 Schools

A booklet on model car design and construction is given to each boy enrolling in the Guild. Prepared by professional designers and engineers, it is the only textbook of its kind for boys wishing to build a model car.

Since 1930, the Fisher Body Competition has awarded 100 university scholarships valued at \$64,500 to national winners. Approximately \$60,000 in cash and other awards have been made to thousands of boys winning state and regional honors. The Fisher Body model car competition has become nationally famous as one of industry's most successful talent sources.
