SAFETY CONFERENCE ATTRACTS THOUSANDS

More than 7,000 people interested in safety activities in Michigan are expected to gather in Grand Rapids April 29-30, for the 27th Annual Michigan Safety Conference.

Represented in conference activities at the Pantland and Rowe hotels and the Civic Auditorium will be ten major divisions embracing major phases of Michigan industry and education.

Themes for the conference is "Eyes, Ears and Hands for Safety" and discussions will carry this theme to application in the various fields of safety activities represented.

Although each of the ten participating divisions will hold special sessions throughout the three-day meeting, an all-conference luncheon will be held Tuesday, April 28 at the Pantland hotel, and an all-conference banquet will close sessions on Thursday evening, April 29 in the Civic Auditorium.

The industrial division, meeting in the Pantland hotel will cover the safety management of small industries, material handling, power press and forging operations, supervisors and employee problems, special problems relative to the chemical industry and atomic power plants and industrial health.

Meeting in the Grand Rapids Civic Auditorium the Public Utilities division will break its coverage into sectional sessions dealing with overhead and underground lines, forestry, gas utilities, and underground utilities.

Offices safety division meeting will also be held in the Civic Auditorium.

The Rural and Women's division will present "A Day at the Safety Fair" in the Civic Auditorium taking an afternoon "don't down with safety." In a county fair atmosphere, with slide shows covering various safety areas, subject matter will include pedestrian and traffic safety, civil defense, safety in the home and on the farm, driver education and 4-H club youth activities.

Panel discussion will feature the Transportation division's program covering workmen's compensation, personal injury accidents, and economic losses of accidents. Presentation of state level truck safety awards will also be made.

The Construction division, represented for the first time in the conference, will hold its meetings in the Manchester Hotel. Sessions will cover the problems of large and small construction contractors with emphasis on accident prevention programs.

Also holding its sessions in the Pantland will be the Traffic Safety division covering law enforcement, traffic safety organizations, action programs, public education and new developments in driver education.

The Governmental Agencies division, meeting in the Pantland, will feature speakers from the Armed Forces branches speaking on the safety programs of various federal agencies.

School and College division sessions will be in the Pantland and Rowe hotels and will include a progress report on the Michigan driver education program as well as the educational needs in major areas of safety.
