

Make the slit as small as possible, but it may have to be a couple of inches long. In case the slit becomes blocked by forage or froth, insert a couple of fingers to open it."

The Supreme Court has made it very difficult to do much about them and they will continue to prove a nuisance to law-enforcement officials. The Senate Internal Security subcommittee and the House Un-American Activities Committee have lost their strongest weapon in the Watkins case decision which seems to me as bad law as it is bad logic.

Most of the investigations will have to do with money and business, an exceedingly complicated field in which the investigator is as likely to pluck thistles as roses.


