This Good Time For Cutting Hay
 Washburn county hay crop is now in the right stage for cutting to produce the best quality feed according to agricultural agent Don Johnson.
 Johnson points out that when only one-tenth to one-third of the plants are in bloom the crop will yield 10 to 20 per cent more protein than when it is in later stages of maturity. Besides this, crops can digest early cut hay more completely than mature hay.
 "When hay is cut at this early stage a dairyman can hold up on milk production with less grain and protein supplement. This saving really shows up next winter," says Johnson. He adds, "The saving in protein alone can amount to as much as \$2 a cow."
 Grasses such as timothy and prairiegrass mature earlier than legumes. To get the most feed value from all hay, meadows that are mostly grass should be harvested first. The clover grows fast from bud stage to full bloom and then hard to catch at the right stage. If they become too mature, leaves fall off and much of the feed value is lost.
 Alfalfa allows the widest range of harvesting time. The protein content drops to 10 to 12 per cent even when harvested late. However, alfalfa produces the most protein and other nutrients per acre when it is cut early, because a larger second crop can be harvested.

 SHRIMP COUNT
 CHICAGO — U-P — An official of the Shrimp Association of the Americas said American fishermen reported 7,000 shrimp boats and marketed 220,000 pounds of shrimp last year, but imports of 68,000 pounds from Mexico still were needed.

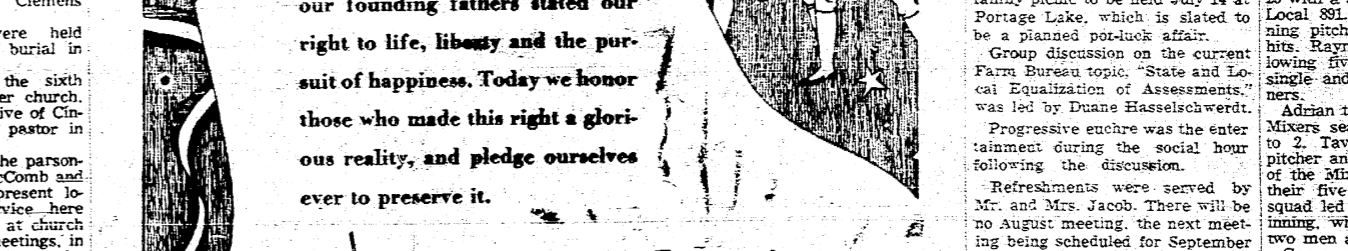
