Because the overall temperature of the entire lake increases as the summer progresses, the infections are rarely noticed beyond the first few weeks of hot weather. The United Church of Christ came into being on June 25 in Cleveland, Ohio, when Dr. James E. Wagner, President of the Evangelical and Reformed Church and Dr. Fred R. Hoskins, Minister and Secretary of the Congregational


