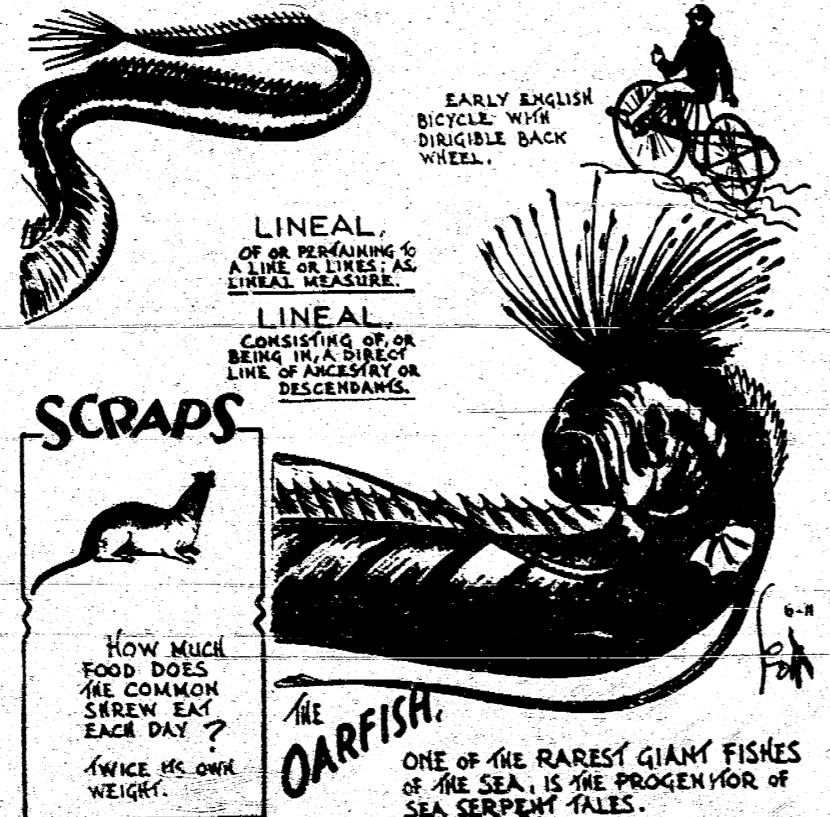
Insects Beware Pleasant Lake To Be Sprayed

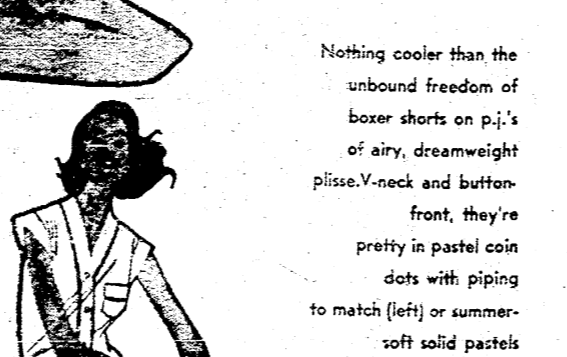

Fall Months, Best For Lambing

Breeding ewes in August and September to lamb in midwinter can be very profitable. U.S. Garrison, Professor of Animal Science at the University of Illinois, points out that midwinter is a good time for ewes to lamb and for lambs to get a good start because farm labor requirements are usually the lowest at that time.

Garrison says ewes can be used for "clean-up" jobs to better advantage after the lambs have gone to market. Early lambs are usually ready for market in May and June, when prices are seasonally high.

The ideal time for lambing is in the fall, when the ewes are in good condition and the lambs are born in good condition.

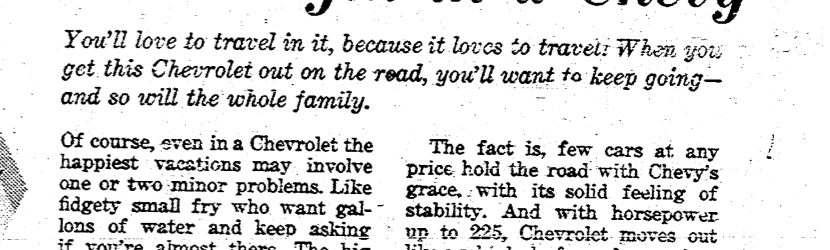
