### Manchester Part Of Defense Alert

Washington County escaped simulated attacks last Friday by H-bombs, disease-bearing bugs, and poisonous gases during the exercise.

"Operation Alert" Civil Defense exercise.

However, the county was needed in the evacuation of Jackson and Detroit, which were two of the 11 Michigan cities to have been "hit" by the hypothetical bombs.

According to Charles Schorber, Manchester Civil Defense director, Manchester was notified of the attack at 11:45 a. m. by the Clinton State Police post. The Clinton post received their notice from the State Police and Civil Defense in Lansing.

In the event that Manchester is attacked in the future, Schorber states that the township fire alarm will emit a "warning sound" for two minutes.

The alert was given in eight telephone messages in the form of codes.

On Thursday both games were a little wider with the Tigers beating the White Sox 12 to 8 and the Yankees winning 9 to 2 over the Dodgers.

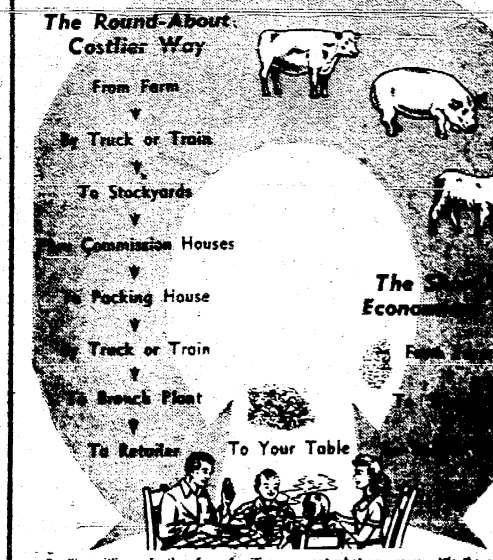

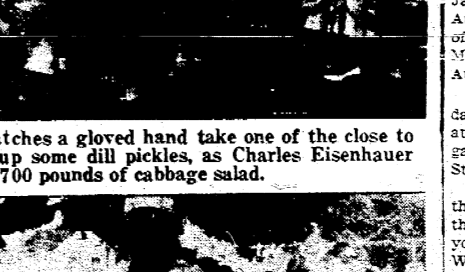

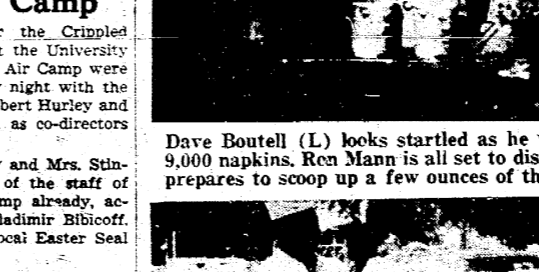
