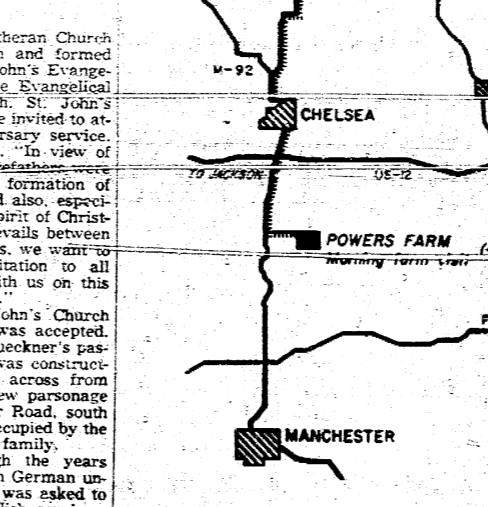

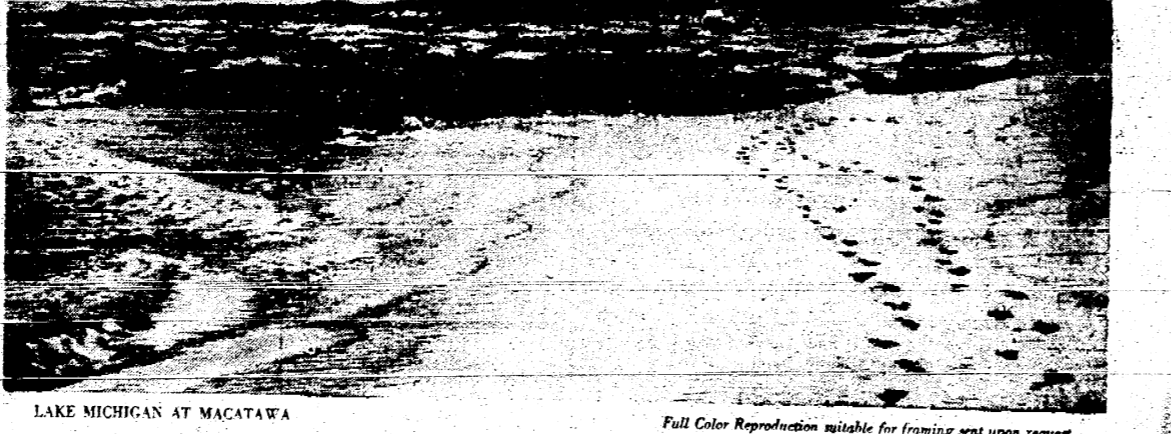

This will be the first camping experience for many of these children, according to Mrs. Vladimir Bibbitt, president of the Washburn County Society for Crippled Children and Adults. She pointed out that children who have been afflicted with poliomyelitis, polio, muscular dystrophy and brain damage will be attending the camp.

The Society is underwriting the costs of the camp with funds obtained in its annual Easter Seal sale to ease the financial burden on the families of the children, and to make sure that no child is turned away due to inability to pay.

Countywide Survey Planned This Month

A countywide survey to look into the rehabilitation needs of all persons who have had polio will be conducted this month by the Washburn County Chapter of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, according to Mrs. Carl Rehberg, of Ann Arbor, chapter chairman.

The local survey is part of a nationwide project by the National Foundation to compile a roster of polio cases of all ages and degrees of disability, regardless of date of onset. The canvass here is to be completed by Sept. 1.

"Modern medicine has made impressive strides in developing new rehabilitation techniques in recent years," Mrs. Rehberg said. "Surveys already show that there are thousands of polio victims in the United States who have not yet had an opportunity for medical attention to determine whether these new techniques might benefit them."

Information sought for each patient includes whether he is employed or attends school, if he can climb stairs and dress himself, whether he receives regular treatment and if he uses respiratory aids. Mrs. Rehberg asks that all persons who have ever had polio send their names and addresses directly to Mrs. Robert Langford, Washburn County Chapter, Nat'l Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, 1313 East Ann St., Ann Arbor.
