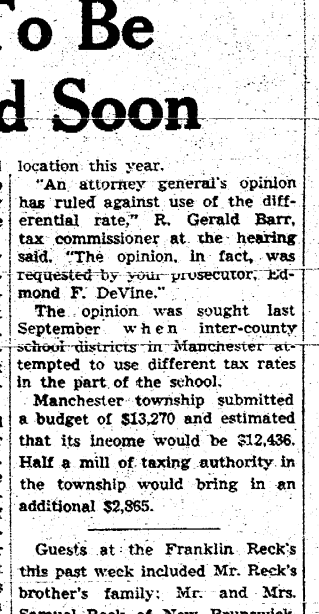

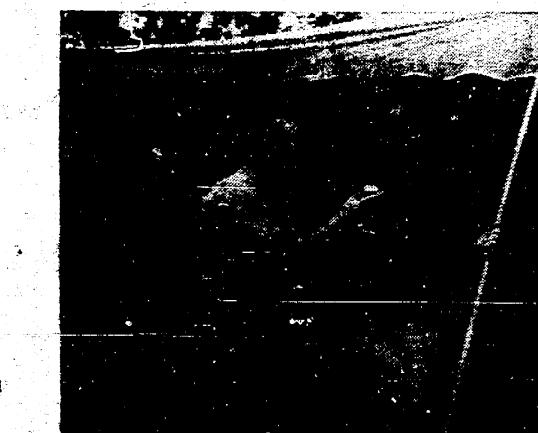

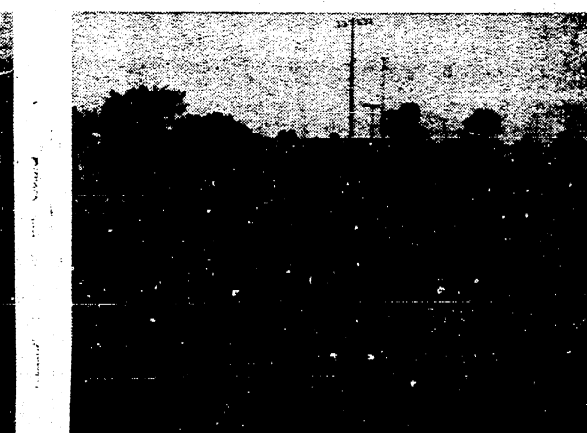
Therese Roberts is seen here with her new prize and joy—the bicycle she won at the Fair.

An interviewer talks with Gordon Grossman, whose steer was Champion of the Fair in Manchester.



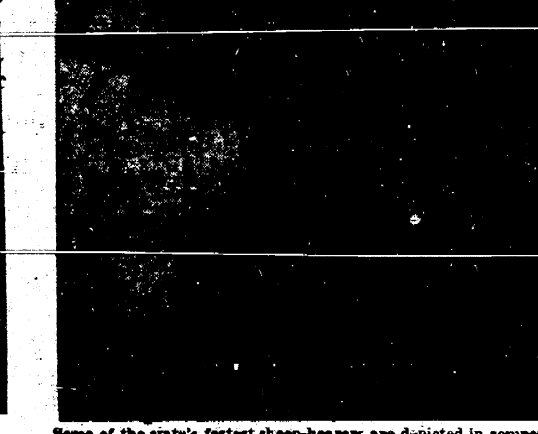

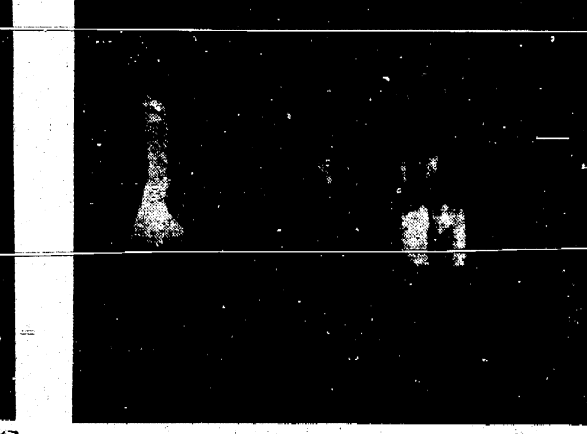
