The Jr. High School had a 10 per cent absenteeism Monday, attributed to influenza and mumps. There has been no rise in the absenteeism in the elementary school at the time of this report.
The illness is a mild type accompanied by fever for two or three days. Health authorities, however, request that the family physician be consulted when symptoms are such as there is a possibility the disease is some other, more serious, and mild flu.
Any child with the flu is asked to stay home. The school will be closed, Mr. Masten reports, because there would not decrease the spread of the illness.
Parents should let the student know where they may be contacted during the day. The school usually the parents if their child becomes ill during the day. The school does not have adequate facilities to care for a large number of ill students, Masten added.
