New Manchester Zoning Code Passed By Council

ORDINANCE NO. 45
VILLAGE OF MANCHESTER
ZONING ORDINANCE

An ordinance to establish districts in the Village of Manchester; to regulate the use of land and structures thereon; to regulate and limit the height, area, bulk and location of buildings; to regulate the location of trades and industries and the location of buildings designed for specific uses; to regulate and determine the area of yards, courts and other open spaces; to regulate the density of population; to provide for a Board of Appeals and its powers and duties; and to provide a penalty for the violation of the terms thereof.

THE VILLAGE OF MANCHESTER
TERMS

ARTICLE I
SHORT TITLE:
This Ordinance shall be known and may be designated as "The Village of Manchester Zoning Ordinance."

1.02 PURPOSE:
The purpose of this Ordinance is to promote the public health, safety and general welfare of the community and a wholesome, serviceable and attractive municipality by having regulations and restrictions that increase the safety and security of home life; that preserve and create a more favorable environment; that stabilize and enhance property and stock values; that facilitate adequate provisions for increased safety in traffic and transportation; that provide for vehicular parking, parks, playgrounds, recreation, public buildings, housing, light, air, water, sewer, sanitation and other public requirements; that lessen congestion, disorder and danger which often result from unregulated municipal development; that prevent overcrowding of land and undue concentration of population; that assist in carrying out a Master Plan for the Village of Manchester; and that provide reasonable and serviceable means and methods of protecting and safeguarding the economic and social interests of the community.

2.15 DWELLING UNIT:
A dwelling unit is a portion of a dwelling providing complete living quarters for one family.

2.15 DWELLING UNIT AREA:
A dwelling unit area is the area within the main walls of a building upon which the pool of all depends. In order to more effectively protect and promote the general welfare and to accomplish the aims and purpose of the comprehensive plan, the Village is divided into districts of such number, shape and area, and of such common use of purpose, adaptability or use, that are deemed most suitable to provide the best civic use, protect the common rights and interests within each district, preserve the general rights and interests of all, and to promote improved, wholesome, dignified, harmonious and economic results in civic service, activities, recreation, and other similar uses.

ARTICLE II
DEFINITIONS:
For the purpose of this Ordinance certain terms are hereby defined. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the plural number and words in the plural number include the singular number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

2.01 ACCESSORY BUILDINGS:
A supplementary building or structure on the same lot or parcel of land as the main building or buildings, or part of the main building occupied by or devoted exclusively to an accessory use, but such use shall not include any building used for dwelling, residential or lodging purposes or sleeping quarters for human beings.

2.02 ACCESSORY USE:
A use naturally and normally incidental to, subordinate to, and devoted exclusively to the main use of the land or buildings.

2.03 ALTERED:
Any change in the location or use of a building, or any change in the supporting members of a building, such as bearing walls, columns, beams, posts, girders and similar components, or any substantial change in the roof or exterior walls.

2.04 BASEMENT AND CELLAR:
(a) A basement is that portion of a building partly below the average grade but so located that the vertical distance from grade to the floor is not greater than the vertical distance from the grade to the ceiling.
(b) A cellar is that portion of a building partly below grade but so located that the vertical distance from the grade to the floor is greater than the vertical distance from the grade to the ceiling.

2.05 BUILDING:
A building is an independent structure having a roof supported by columns or walls resting on its own foundations and includes detached garages, stable, greenhouses or other accessory buildings. A detached building is one separated on all sides from adjacent buildings by open spaces from the ground up.

2.06 COURT:
A court is an open, unoccupied space bounded on two or more sides by the exterior walls of a building or exterior walls and lot lines.

2.07 COURT, INNER:
An inner court is a court enclosed on all sides by exterior walls of a building or building exterior walls and lot lines, on which walls are allowable.

2.08 COURT, OUTER:
An outer court is a court enclosed on not more than three sides by exterior walls and lot lines on which walls are allowable with one side open to a street, alley or yards.

2.08 DWELLING:
A dwelling is a building designed or used exclusively for sleeping quarters for one or more families but does not include trailer coaches.

2.10 DWELLING, MULTIPLE:
A multiple dwelling is a dwelling unit and designed as a residence for more than one family, but not independently of each other and having their own cooking facilities, including apartment houses, apartment hotels, flats and group houses.

2.11 DWELLING, ONE-FAMILY:
A one-family dwelling is a detached building designed for or occupied exclusively by one family.

2.12 DWELLING, TWO-FAMILY:
A two-family dwelling is a dwelling designed for or occupied exclusively by two families living independently of each other.

2.13 DWELLING, ROW:
A dwelling row is a row of 2 to 6 attached one-family dwellings not more than two and one-half stories in height, not more than two and one-half stories in depth, and having a common rear line of a lot measured in the general direction of its side lot line.

2.14 DWELLING UNIT:
A dwelling unit is a portion of a dwelling providing complete living quarters for one family.

2.15 DWELLING UNIT AREA:
A dwelling unit area is the area within the main walls of a building upon which the pool of all depends. In order to more effectively protect and promote the general welfare and to accomplish the aims and purpose of the comprehensive plan, the Village is divided into districts of such number, shape and area, and of such common use of purpose, adaptability or use, that are deemed most suitable to provide the best civic use, protect the common rights and interests within each district, preserve the general rights and interests of all, and to promote improved, wholesome, dignified, harmonious and economic results in civic service, activities, recreation, and other similar uses.

2.17 LOT, DEPTH OF:
The depth of a lot is the average distance between the front and rear line of a lot measured in the general direction of its side lot line.

2.18 LOT, WIDTH OF:
The width of a lot is the average width measured at right angles to its depth.

2.19 MOTEL:
A motel is any establishment in which individuals or units, are let or rented to transient guests for periods of less than one month. This term shall include tourist courts and motor courts. A motor court or motel shall not be considered or occupied as a hotel.

2.23 NON-CONFORMING USE:
A non-conforming use is a structure or land lawfully occupied by a use that does not conform to the regulations of the Use District in which it is situated.

2.24 ROOMING HOUSE:

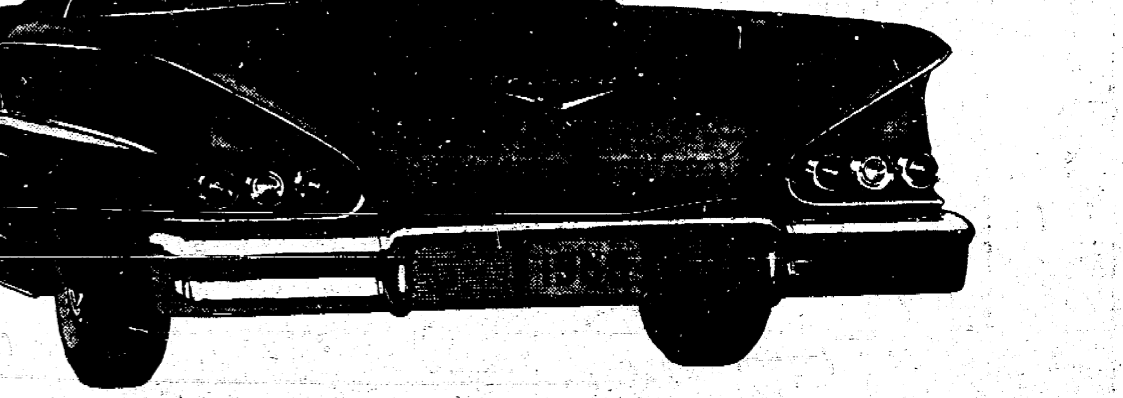

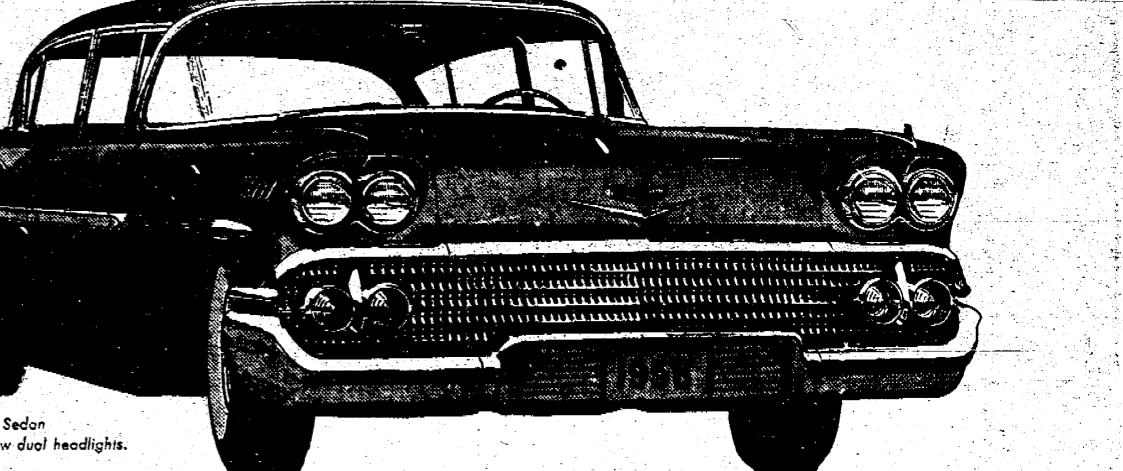

New Policy Lifts "Red Tape" In Auto Accidents

A completely new and broader insurance policy, which relieves the policyholder of the necessity of taking legal action against the insured or his-and-run driver legally liable in an automobile action, was announced this week by Sutton Agency Inc. of Manchester.

Called "Featurama" by its originator, the policy was developed in Michigan, the policy arranged for settlement for damages caused by an uninsured motorist or his-and-run driver legally liable for the accident.

Another section of the policy covers living in the home while they are not in the car, should they be injured in an automobile accident.

The Michigan Department of Health announced recently that it has awarded a certificate of achievement to Allen Luckhardt of Manchester, Supt. of Public Works here. He was one of 66 water treatment plant operators to pass written examinations and meet certain other requirements.

According to law, every water treatment plant in Michigan must be supervised by a certified operator. To qualify for a certificate, a candidate must meet certain educational and experience qualifications established by the state health department.

New Ordinance Of Importance To All

Provisions of the new Manchester Zoning Ordinance should be understood and followed by all residents of the Village of Manchester. It was pointed out this week. The Ordinance becomes effective Nov. 24, 1957, and was published in its entirety in last week's issue of the Manchester Enterprise.

The purpose of the law, as stated in Article 1, is "to promote a wholesome, serviceable and attractive municipality, to increase the safety and security of home life, to preserve and create a more favorable environment, to provide for vehicular parking, recreation, public buildings, housing, light, air and other public requirements, to prevent overcrowding of land and undue concentration of population, and to regulate... the location, bulk, height, occupancy and uses of buildings, etc."

The general trend of the complete 1957 law was toward the accomplishment of making Manchester a more beautiful place to live. This fact is pointed out by the author.

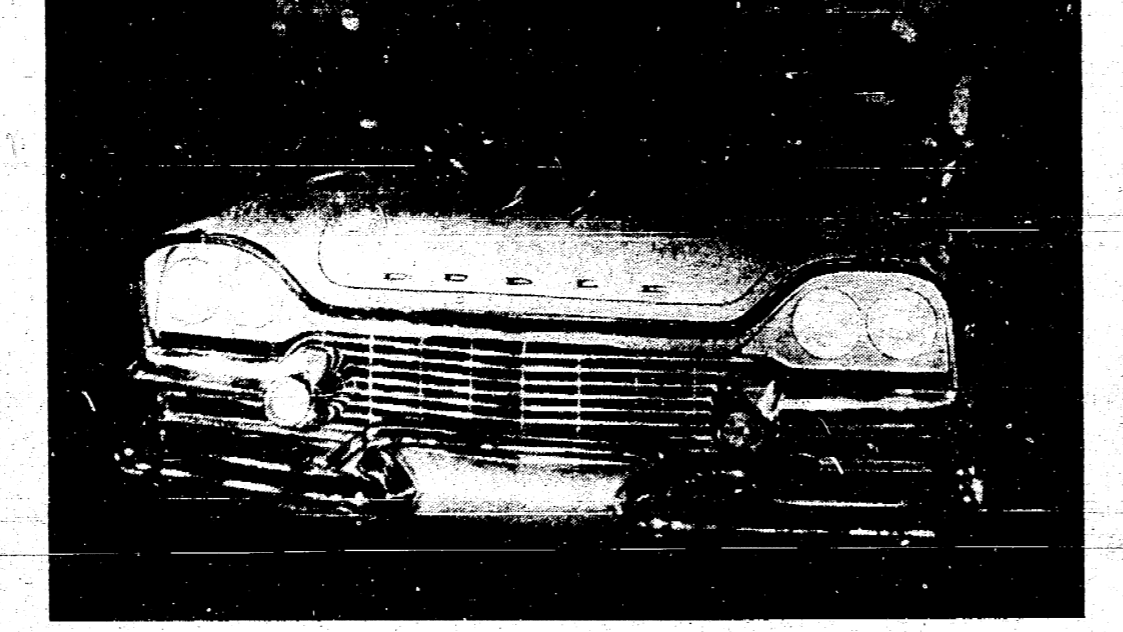
