Remember Pianos Need Extra Care

The National Piano Manufacturers Association says new owners of pianos should have them tuned three or four times the first year and twice a year thereafter. Placement of the piano also is important. The Association says it should be kept out of direct sunlight and away from radiators to insure the best musical tone. Hammers, dampers and other felt materials in the music-making workings are moth-eaten and the Association says that a home with special moth problems should give pianos extra protection. A bag of moth-repellent crystals should be hung in the interior. Polish and dust the piano just like any other furniture. To keep the keys bright, wipe them with a cloth that has been dipped in plain water or a mild soap solution and then wrung almost "dry." To keep light-colored fabrics clean while sewing, dust hands with cornstarch before beginning. The cornstarch will absorb perspiration.

Texture Counts In Snow Scene

When snow is on the ground, the textures of trees and shrubs stand out in the landscape more than at other times. In the late fall, before snow covers the ground, the last leaves of deciduous trees are on the verge of falling, except for the earlier brilliant splashes of October. Contrasted with the still-green grass and the brown and tan of the trees and shrubs, the textures are blurred by withered clinging leaves. At that season, when December is here, the skeletons of deciduous woody plants stand out clearly against the winter sky.

Mountain Ash Gives Color

The American Mountain Ash, Sorbus aucuparia, is a woody shrub or small tree growing as high as thirty feet. Santa's Due In Manchester

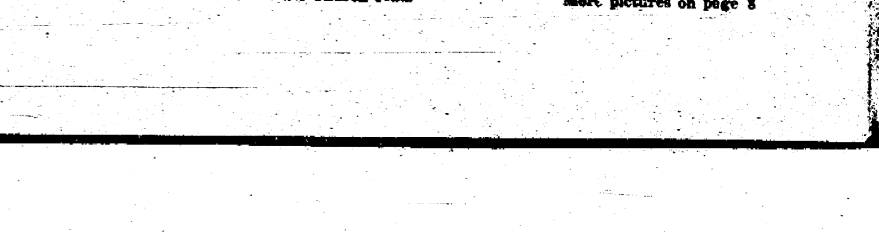
