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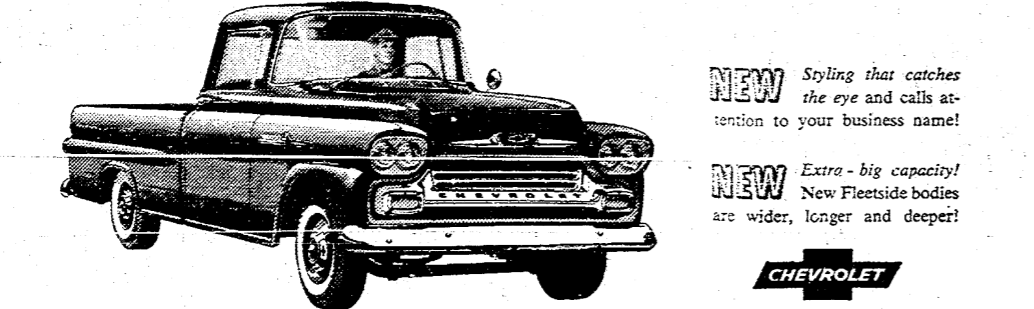

## Louvers Add Fashion Note To Old Doors

Louvered doors are attractive "dress-up" for your linen closets, bedrooms and utility rooms. They're inexpensive and easy to make, with the aid of your workshop power tools. If you have an old paneled door that you may no longer have in use, point out the home specialists of Thor Power Tool Company of Chicago.

Besides being highly fashionable, louvered doors provide ventilation for areas that normally are closed.

The stock that's required costs about \$3 to \$5 depending on your local lumber rates. Here's what you'll need: 1/2 by 2 1/2 inch stock for the louver framing; 1/2 by 1/2 inch pine strips for the louvers; a handful of six penny finishing nails, and, of course, the old paneled door.

With an electric saw or jig saw attachment of your electric drill, cut out the entire interior panels of the door. After these have been removed, frame the opening with the door frame. The louver frame should be notched with 1/4-inch dados (square) bottom channel slip) 1/4-inch deep. The dados should be spaced 2 1/2 inches apart. Slip the louvers into the dados and nail them into position. Be careful not to split the louvers when driving nails through the louver frame.

Place this entire louver assembly into the door frame and fasten it with several finishing nails on each side. Exercise care not to splinter or crack the louvers while hammering.

The door can be painted quickly with a spray gun. If you don't have one, it's advisable to paint the louvers before they are installed in the louver frame.

## Plain Stock Often Ideal For Projects

Stretch those dollars you're spending on lumber with a few simple upgrading tips that make common lumber as practical as a select grade.

Upgraded lumber often costs only half as much as better grades and serves just as well as if the project—a bookcase, record cabinet or room divider—is to be painted.

Milling operations often roughen lower grade lumber but this can be overcome quickly and easily with an electric sander and a plane. Plane out the major roughness and power sand the minor defects, suggest home workshop specialists of Thor Power Tool Company of Chicago.

Then, use your electric saw to cut out the bad defects. Small cracks and checks can be filled with wood filler or mixture of glue and fine sawdust. After these fillers have dried, sand the area smooth with a power sander or the sanding attachment of your electric drill.

Stains and mars can be removed with a commercial wood bleach. Exercise caution when using such
