This thought was brought home to me a few weekends ago when I took my car into Joe's garage. I've been doing business with Joe for 15 years. In that time, his garage has changed considerably. At the beginning, Joe had only a grease pit and a hydraulic lift. Today, he has a battery of machines and meters he uses in diagnosing my car's ills.

On this business of automation, I asked Joe if servicing my car hadn't-become a fot easier with the "gadgets" he now had.

Of course, Joe said. These new devices helped since automobile machinery has become so highly complex. But he told me that there wasn't one thing any machine could do for my car if he didn't stay abreast of automotive servicing techniques.

He had just returned from the Carter Carburetor Factory Serv-

He had just returned from the Carter Carburetor Factory Service School in St. Louis. Although he was one of the school's first students back in 1934 when it began, he goes back for a two-week course in automotive fuel system maintenance every few years.

Now, I had always respected my mechanic. Over the years, I've always had smooth-running cars thanks to him. But since this conversation, I've begun to think of him as a highly trained technician. I also realize that all the automation in the world can't do the job without him. It made me realize that no electronic brain could ever replace my mechanic's horse-power horse sense.
