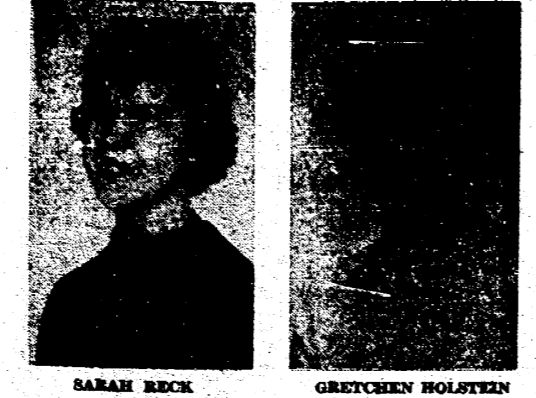

Eight-Year-Olds Separated From Others To Learn Game

When interviewed as to the reason for the separation of eight-year-olds from the other Little League players, Eugene Bentschneider, a father and a team manager, gave the following explanation: "The Little League is getting Village and much work by the off to a very good start this year with a large number of new boys coming out this year. Most of the new boys are eight-year-olds without any experience in playing hard ball. Carl Wuerthner Officer Of Maccabee Camp

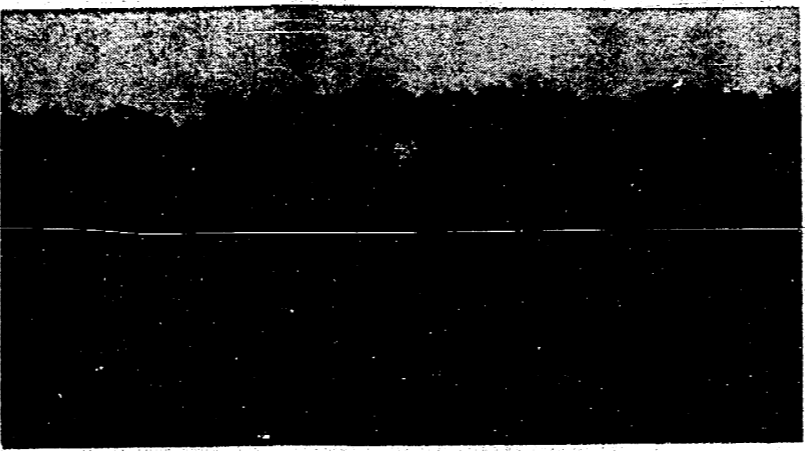
