- 1. To study and observe all laws and regulations state, county and local.
- 2. To pass an annual physical examination paid by the board of education.
- 3. To be clean and neat in appearance.
- 4. To refrain from the use of tobacco while on duty.
- 5. To use no profane language in the presence of school children.
- 6. To participate in conferences for school bus drivers.
- 7. To maintain order and discipline on the bus.
- 8. To refrain from use of intoxicating liquor while on duty.
- 9. To permit a child to leave the bus only at the regular stop except upon written request of parents or direction of the school authority.
- 10. To have children pass in front of the bus when leaving the bus and crossing the highway. The driver should not start the bus until the child who must cross the highway has done so.
- 11. To be sure that all children are seated whenever the bus is in motion.
- 12. To make sure that all children are off the bus whenever a bus is released.
- 13. To drive at a safe speed—never exceed forty-five miles an hour.

Report From Supt. Of Schools

During the 1957-58 school year, your school district operated at a budget of \$1,100,000. The value of these buildings is estimated at \$1,100,000.

There were 1067 school age children on the census and the school year ended with 990 children in school. There were 203 young adults in the graduating class.

The board levied 11.5 mills for operation which was \$1,121,298 and 4.25 mills for debt which amounted to \$138,234. The tax collection was approximately 96% of the amount levied.

Our financial condition is in a satisfactory state. The school year ended with a cash balance of \$125,987. There was outstanding debt of \$15,797.
