Free Chest X-Rays Available Here Monday, Nov. 24

The search for unknown tuberculosis cases in Manchester gets underway next week. A specially equipped X-ray bus will be parked at Main Street near the bridge on Monday, Nov. 24, from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. Free chest X-rays will be available to everyone 18 and over. The unit will move on to Chelsea, Nov. 25, and will be in Dexter on Nov. 26. The procedure for an X-ray is quick and simple. There is no undressing and no red tape. The whole process takes less than three minutes. Recent advances in the use of wonder drugs have made recovery and return to work speedy and certain. Dr. Engleke emphasized.
