## One Slate Filled At Caucuses



A section of Logan Road (Adrian Street) on the south side of Manchester which was washed out Sunday morning when a dam broke during an attempt to open an ice-clogged spillway. The dam was on the property of Charles Carlton, Sr., who last year built a private lake and stocked it with fish. The lake, which normally covers about 20 acres at a depth of 10 feet, empties into a creek which passes through a culvert under Logan road at the south village limits. The lake was drained within about two hours.

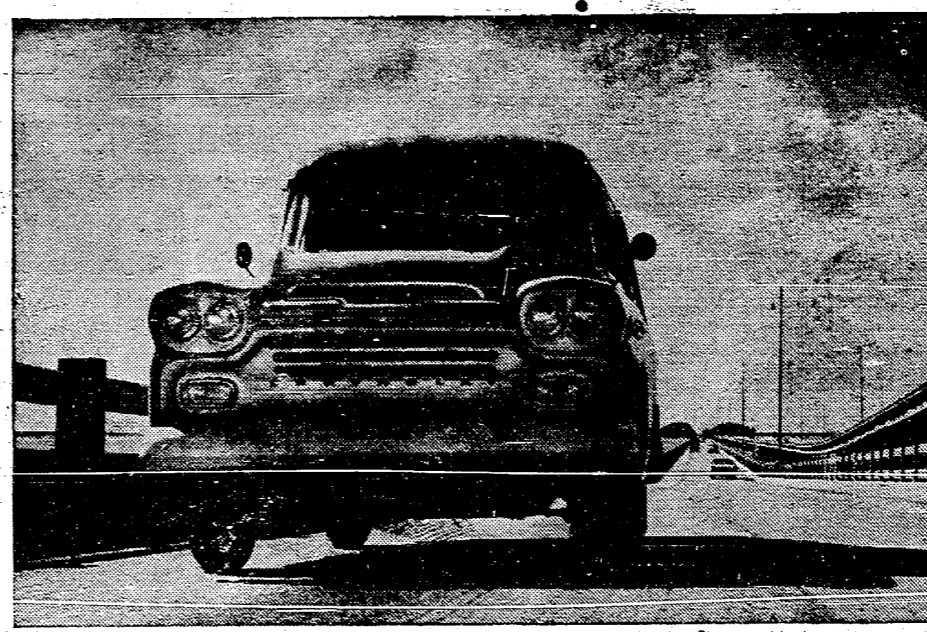
