DANCE RECITAL

The sponsored dance recital "Ye Old Toy Shopp" was held Friday, May 1 at the Civic auditorium at 8 p.m. Reports general chairman, Mrs. H. C. Ayers. The 31 Manchester students and the other 5.5 mills go to the county. Manchester gets the same millage rate as last year. Salem gets 1 mill and 25000 27 mills Augustus and Saline townships, which requested millage for the first time in recent years, were refused a preliminary allocation although they may receive a final allocation.

Officials for the county submitted a budget calling for 6 mills of the property tax. The county budget for 1960 totals \$3,175,224 with \$2,699,918 to be collected from the property tax.

The County tax Allocation Board will reconvene at 10 a.m. Thursday, May 26 in Room 1 in the basement of the County Building to hold a hearing on the preliminary allocations. A final allocation must be made by the board by June 1.

Augustus township requested a half-mill allocation by submitting a budget requiring \$1,200 from the property tax. Saline township also asked for \$15,987. Saline township seeks a share of the property tax to cover increases in work it plans to have done on its highways and increases in the salaries of township officers.
