The Manchester Public Schools Board of Education is asking for a 1 1/2 mill levy for one year to keep the school system running on the same high quality plane as has been the custom in this community. We urge your support of this levy and also of the 1/2 mill special education levy.

Voting place for the election Monday is the high school music room at 710 E. Main St. Polls will be open from 1 p.m. to 8 p.m. and all persons over 21 years of age who have been a resident of the State of Michigan for six months and a resident of Manchester Public School District for 30 days are eligible to vote.

It is hoped that a large number of the qualified electors vote since this is the only positive way of knowing the wishes of the people.

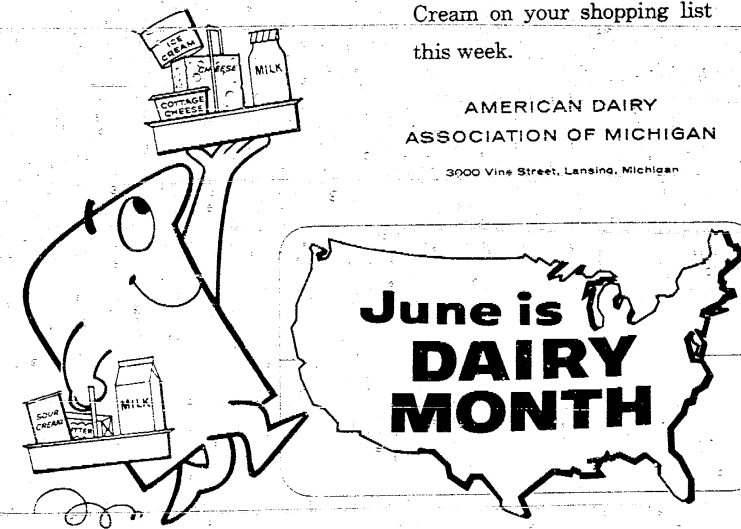

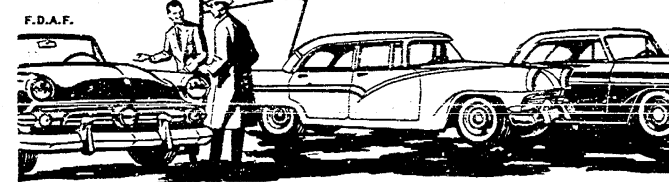
