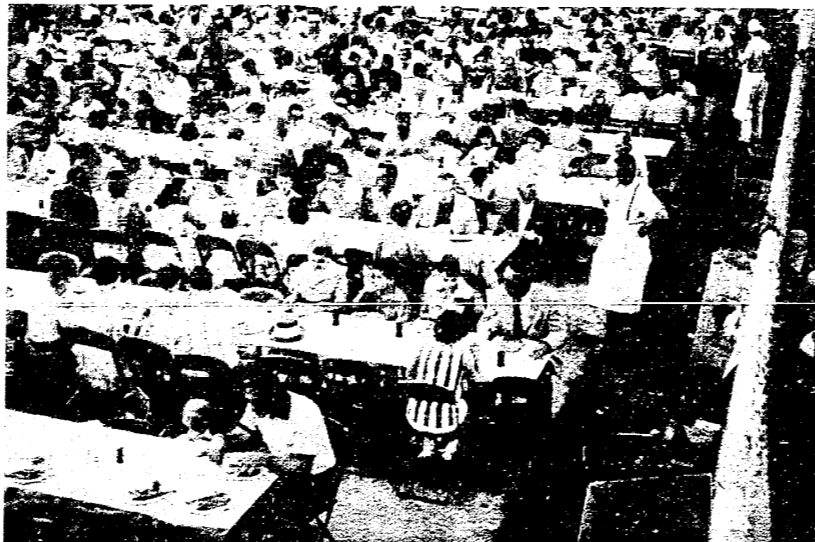
6th Annual Optimist and J. C. Chicken Broil A Large Success

Rev. Ernest J. Kilbourne, recently returned from Japan, will speak at the Manchester Baptist Chapel on Sunday, August 9th at 7:45 p.m. He will also speak at Sterling's Room, 12670 N. Territorial, Dexter, at 7:45 p.m., Saturday, August 8th. Everyone welcome to these services.

Ernest Kilbourne is a third generation missionary, and a grandson of Ernest A. Kilbourne who, with Charles E. Cowman pioneered the work of the Oriental Missionary Society in Japan. (Mrs. Charles Cowman is the author of the devotional books *Springs in the Valley* and *Streams in the Desert*). Mr. Kilbourne was born in Japan and spent his childhood and early youth in Korea and China.

He began his missionary career in Peking, China; continued it in Honolulu among the Japanese; and spent his last term in Japan where God used him in a unique way to encourage the pastors and evangelists in the Japan O. M. S. Church.

Ernest Kilbourne has learned the secret of working along side of the nationals as a helper and not as an overseer. His work has taken him throughout the length and breadth of post-war Japan and his message is full of up-to-date information on conditions there, and on the advance of missions since the occupation.
