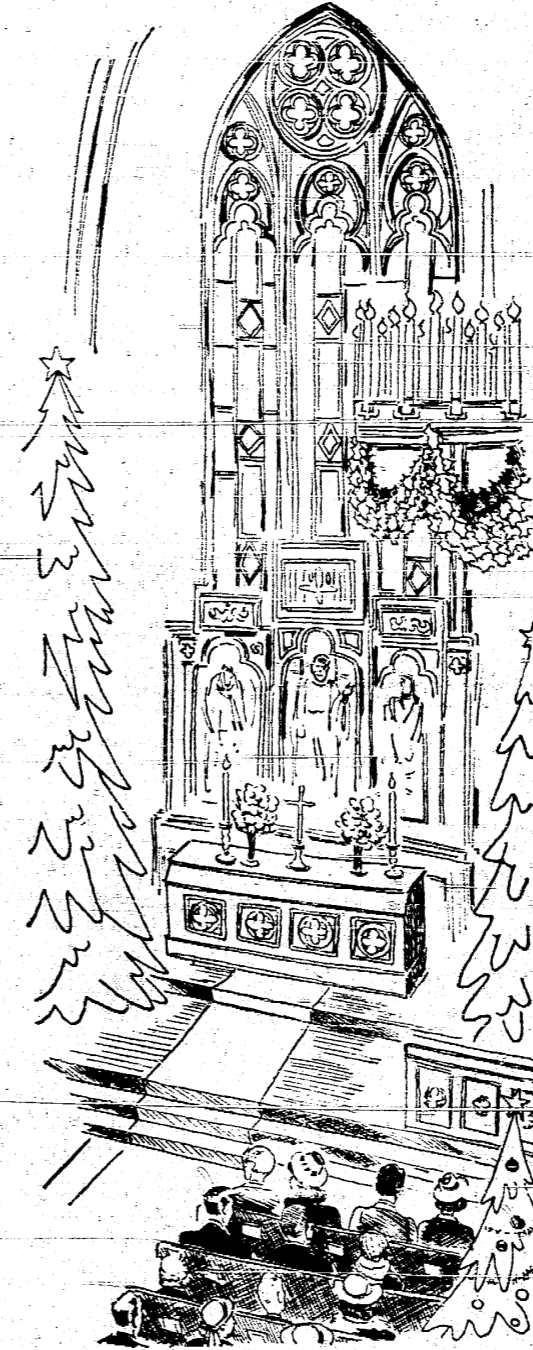

"In an auspicious corner, near a warming hearth, the Good Book rests on a small oaken stand."

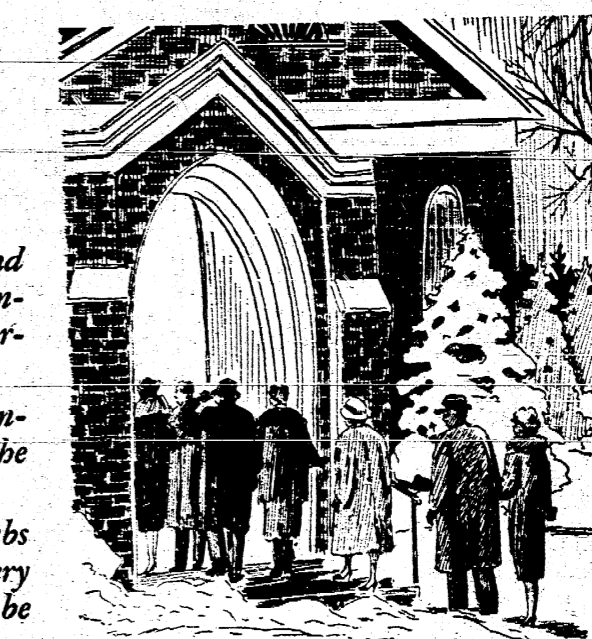

**CHRISTMAS CHURCH SERVICES PLANNED  
IN LOCAL AREA**

Christmas Services slated in the Manchester churches are as follows: At St. Mary's there will be Midnight Mass, starting Christmas eve with Christmas carols before the Mass at 11:30 p.m., with the senior choir singing. This midnight Mass will be followed by two low Masses. Christmas Day December at 9 a.m. there will be a low mass with the junior choir according to pastor, Fr. William Schneider. All are welcome at these services.
