**Final Drive for Red Cross Headquarters Now Under Way**



**FINAL DRIVE FOR RED CROSS HEADQUARTERS NOW UNDER WAY**

Manchester Red Cross volunteer workers who drive to Ann Arbor, attempt to find a parking place, and climb the narrow stairs to the overcrowded Red Cross headquarters on the second floor of the Nickells Arcade, are aware that the Washtenaw Chapter needs a new headquarters. With its ever-expanding humanitarian services, the Red Cross has outgrown its rented space.

To meet this long overdue need, the Washtenaw Chapter inaugurated a low-pessure drive last spring for \$200,000 to build a new headquarters on Packard Road. During the rest of the year, without any great amount of publicity, the drive committee raised \$61,500, almost a third of the amount. Manchester did considerably better than most small communities by raising \$309.

This spring the drive is being resumed under the chairmanship of Edward Adams, Jr., of Ann Arbor, with T. Hawley Tapping, former alumni secretary of the University of Michigan, as consultant. They hope to raise the balance of the money in April.

The Manchester part of the drive is being conducted by the following committee: Franklin H. Reck, chairman, Mrs. Laurel Breitenwischer, James C. Hendley, J.R. Jones, Luther Klager, John Pippingier, Mrs. Norman Randall, Stanton Roesch and Mrs. Louis D. Vogel.

As explained by Mr. Adams, the proposed building is to be an economy structure stressing utility, providing office space, kitchen for disaster feeding, rooms for conferences, classes and lectures, badly needed storage space; and just as important, ample parking space. Red Cross supplies are stored in churches, attics, and basements of homes throughout the area.

**PROPOSED NEW RED CROSS HEADQUARTERS. The new Red Cross Headquarters will be located on Packard Road next to Buhr Park. It will be modern and flexible, but without luxury, and will have room to expand as the need grows. Movable metal partitions will permit changing room size.**

The present drive, Mr. Tapping explains, is not a part of the annual Community Fund drive. In the Manchester Community Fund; money is collected for local and national humanitarian services. It pays for the running expenses for these services.

The Building Fund drive, on the other hand, is for much-needed capital improvement. It is not repeated. The Manchester Committee plans to conduct and complete its share of the drive in April.

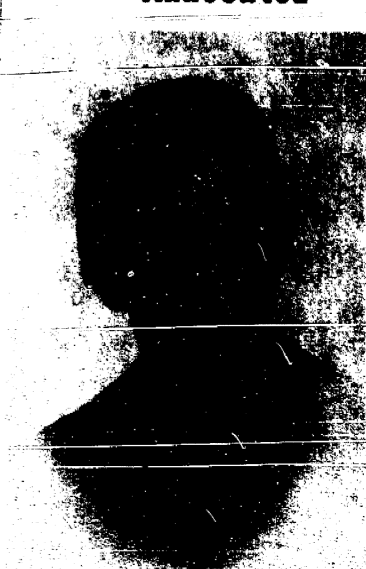

### Local Volunteers Serve The Red Cross In Manchester

Manchester people, in their daily lives, are deeply involved in the services of the American Red Cross.

How deeply Manchester is involved is dramatically illustrated in this issue of the Enterprise. For those of us who are inclined to take the Red Cross for granted, this issue will be an eye opener. Published here are the photos of most of the seventy-five local men and women—unpaid volunteers all—who worked on Red Cross programs in 1961.

One of the principal activities of the town is the Blood Bank. To service this highly important and popular program requires staff aides, registrars, a doctor, nurses, nurses' aides, canteen workers and pre-registration committee. All of these are local people. During 1961, almost 200 pints of blood were

without charge, a trained water-front director for the summer swimming program.

Home service is another Red Cross activity important to Manchester people who have sons and daughters in the Armed Services. Through home service, the Red Cross takes care of the emergencies and difficulties involving service men away from home and their

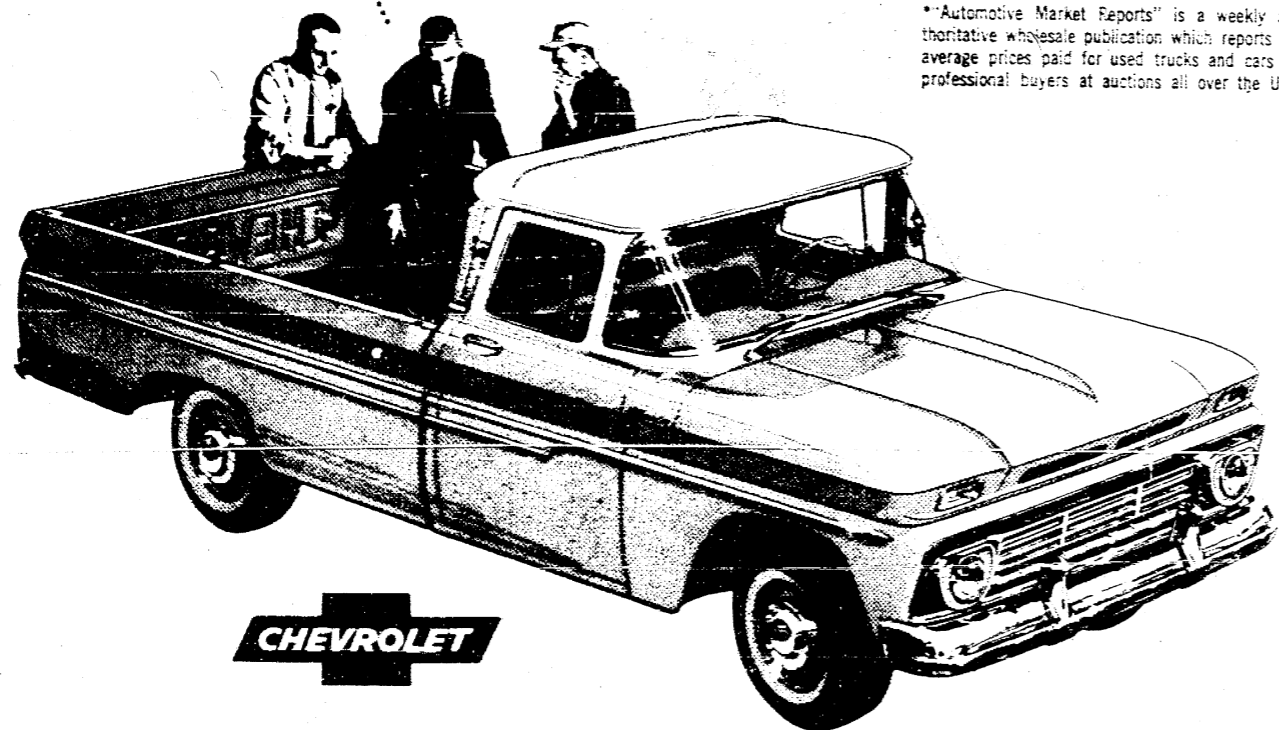

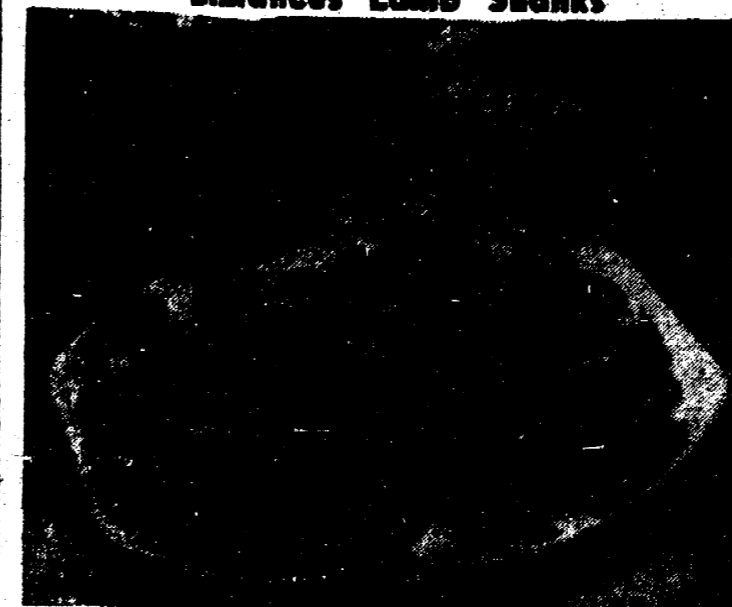

### Sweet Sour Raisin Sauce Enhances Lamb Shanks



Sweet California raisins add their delightful taste surprise to this economical yet glamorous entree. First, simmer lamb shanks in a sweet sour mixture of pineapple juice and vinegar for tenderness and flavor. Then add raisins and vegetables to cook in the tangy juice the last half hour. The thickened pan liquid is delicious sauce to serve over the richly flavored meat and vegetables.

#### ELEGANT LAMB SHANKS WITH RAISIN SAUCE

4 lamb shanks  
 Salt and pepper  
 Shortening  
 1 1/2 cups pineapple juice  
 2 tablespoons vinegar

3 medium carrots  
 8 small white boiling onions  
 1/2 cup dark or golden raisins  
 1 tablespoon cornstarch  
 1 tablespoon cold water

Sprinkle lamb shanks with salt and pepper. Brown slowly on all sides in small amount of shortening. Add pineapple juice and vinegar. Cover and simmer until tender, about 1 1/2 hours. Add carrots cut into chunks, onions and raisins to lamb shanks. Simmer until vegetables are tender, about 30 minutes. Skim any fat from surface. Mix cornstarch with cold water and stir into liquid. Cook until mixture boils thoroughly and is thickened. Arrange meat and vegetables on serving platter and cover with sauce. Makes 4 servings.

1 pound fish fillets or steaks (fresh or frozen)	1 cup sliced celery
3 cups milk	1 cup water
1 cup light cream	1 cup diced raw potatoes
1 can O & C French Fried Onions	1 cup diced carrots
1/2 cup raw bacon pieces	1 bay leaf, crumbled
	1/2 cup butter or margarine
	Salt and pepper to taste

Thaw fillets or steaks, if frozen. Cut fish into bite-size pieces. Mix milk, cream and onions and set aside to soak. Cook bacon in large saucepan until lightly browned. Add celery and cook until softened. Add water, potatoes, carrots and bay leaf. Cover and cook for 10 minutes. Add fish, onion-milk mixture and butter. Bring to boil. Reduce heat, cover and simmer 5 to 8 minutes or until fish flakes easily when tested with a fork. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Serve with a garnish of canned French fried onions and a sprinkling of paprika. (Makes 6 servings)

To save time, make up a big batch of the chowder the night before it's to be served. Keep it refrigerated in a tightly covered jar. It's just wonderful reheated and the flavors seem to mingle and blend.

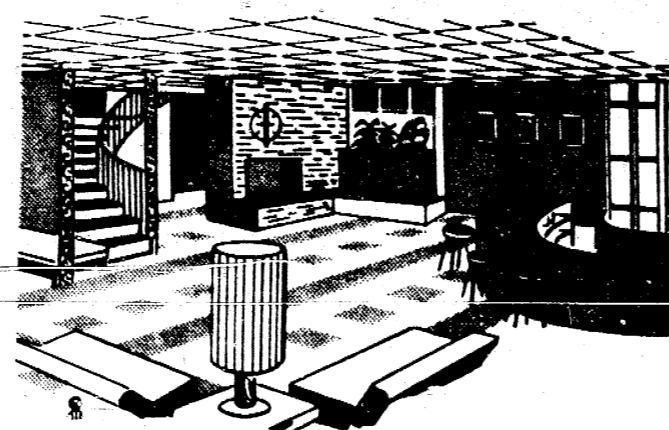

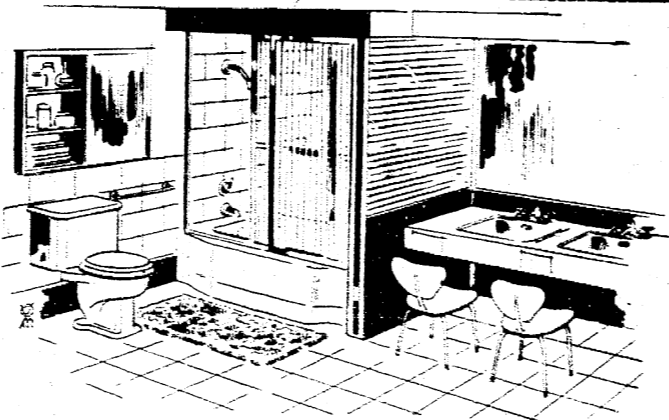

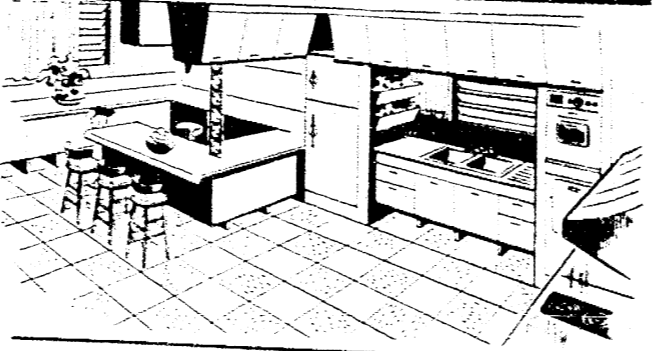

### Manchester School Board Adopts New Salary Schedule

At a special school board meeting, held Thursday evening the Manchester Board of Education implemented a new salary scale for the 1962-63 school year.

The topic of teachers salaries had been considered at several previous meetings. The board finance committee had studied several proposals intensively.

The new basic schedule begins at \$4450.00 and extends to \$56,000.00 over a ten year period. There are several additions to the basic schedule for Masters Degree, above average teaching, head of household and military experience. There are also additions for extra work performed.

The new schedule gives an average pay raise of \$155.00 per person on and above what the 1961 pay scale would have provided, however this raise is not equally distributed.

Many items will have to be held to a minimum to provide for the raise in pay. The board was not satisfied with this aspect of the school budget planning, but felt that it was necessary to hold the line to the four mills extra voted tax which runs out this year and in all probability will be requested again at the annual election.
