

HIT-RUN PROBE HELP REQUESTED

Sheriff Douglas J. Harvey has made an appeal to the public to help in apprehending the driver of the car which struck and critically injured a 13-year-old Northfield Township boy on Saturday night. The condition of Randolph Picout of 4445 Pontiac Trail remained unchanged at University Hospital Wednesday where he was reported in "fair" condition.

The teen-ager received a leg fracture and serious head injuries when the bicycle he was riding near his home Saturday was struck by a hit-and-run driver. Harvey urged persons who were in the Pontiac Trail area between the hour of 6:30 and 7:30 p.m. Saturday and who may have seen the car involved to relay the information to his office. The sheriff said that maybe the person who hit the boy may not have been aware that he did. But he urges the person to come in and make a report on the matter. There are five detectives working on the case and it is only a matter of time before the person will be arrested, the sheriff said.

Officers said an analysis of paint scrapings taken from a radio antenna yanked from the car in the accident and other paint traces on the Picout boy's clothing indicate the vehicle which hit the youth was a 1964 or 1965 Ford product. Detective Lt. C. Hollis, who is

heading the investigation said the color is listed as "Rangoon red" and the vehicle involved could be a car or a pickup truck.

St. Mary's House Tour Thursday, October 7th.

The annual house tour sponsored by St. Mary's Altar Society will be held from one to five, Thursday, October 7. Regardless of what type of home visitors are interested in there would be several which would intrigue them.

Mrs. Richard Way and Mrs. Marvin Kirk, who lead the committee have selected homes which vary from the most modern to some with lovely antiques. The house structures differ, too. Some are brand new, some are older homes—one dates back more than a century. The settings vary from Main Street to lovely country landscapes. For those unfamiliar with the locations of the homes, the committee suggests that the tour might well start at St. Mary's Church hall on West Main Street where tickets and maps will make the tour very simple to follow. Every home need not be visited and those touring can begin at any location starting at one. Refreshments will be served in the church hall as a part of the program.

If it is a new home that interests you, the Leo Lentz residence at 20415 Boetger Road might be your choice. It has lovely modern furnishings and new color schemes. Don't miss the little girl's room with its French provincial furniture and the decor planned by Mrs. Lentz.

At the end of East Main Street live the F. W. Schillers at 105 Hibbard Road. Follow the "private drive" to the residence. At the entrance note the hand finished mirror and chest done by Mrs. Schiller. The spacious living room looks out on a terrace shaded by a huge maple. Of particular interest are the paintings by the hostess and her daughter. Those interested in antiques will love to browse at the Burrill Hansen home at 400 North Union Street. The house known as "Becky and Schaeble's" holds treasures from Europe and many parts of this country. An old bottle collection is the envy of many. There are saddle brasses from a London flea market on the living room wall, a captain's desk from a schooner in New Orleans, and a child's table is now a coffee table. There are lovely old rockers and antique pictures in this fine collection by Mrs. Hansen who uses her ingenuity to excellent advantage in the clever bathroom. Much of the actual labor in restoring many of these articles has been done by the Hansens.

If you are interested in what can be done with an out-dated rural school visit the Charles Galinis home at 12240 Bethel Church Road. Erected in 1859 the Silver Lake one-room schoolhouse has been converted into an eight-room home. The two wings were added by the present owners. The living room windows overlook Silver Lake. The landscaped garden forms a perfect background for the house. Don't miss the school bell in the yard. Another interesting feature is the carved oak table and chairs in the dining room.

The William Brady residence at 10300 Grossman Road combines modern appearance and convenience with the pleasures of country living for the home is back from the main road. The cut stone fireplace adds a pleasant note.

The family of Mrs. Marie Scheurer of 400 East Main Street dates back to one of the early families of the Manchester area. Some of the furnishings in her home also claim that heritage. The hand carved black walnut bedroom suite is more than 125 years old. If you want to see a gracious pleasant atmosphere be sure and stop at this home.

If you have ever wondered how to convert a summer cottage into a year round home then the J. L. Scott's place at 11059 Pleasant Lake Road should be on your list to see. New color ideas are portrayed. Be sure and note the unique divider between the kitchen and living room. The fall colors at Pleasant Lake at this time of year add to the beauty.

We think you'll find the "Little Logan Barn" in its rustic setting at 20599 Logan Road a real surprise. The owners are Mr. and Mrs. Glen Nealand of Ypsilanti. You won't want to miss it. It is unusual and charming.

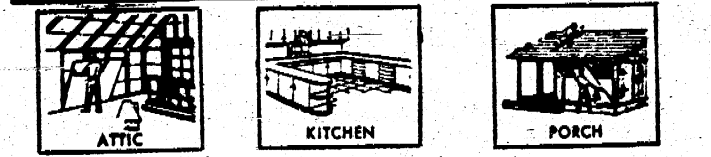
COMMITTEE OF MEN TO EXPLAIN CHURCH BUDGET
