

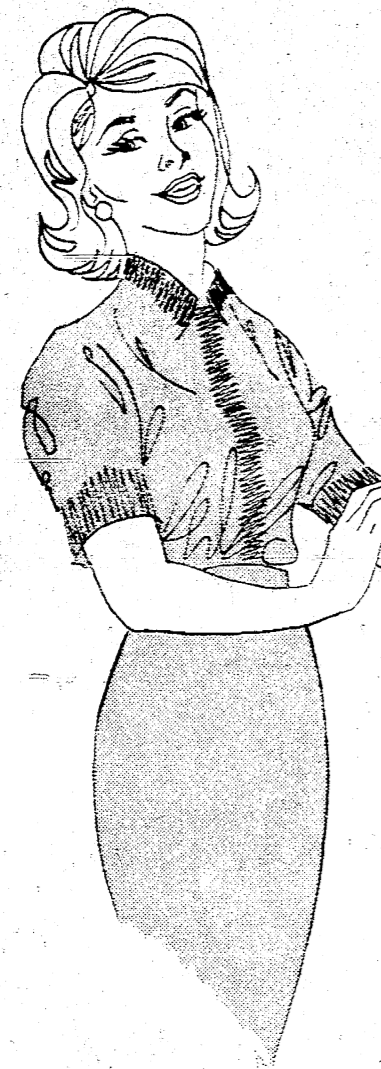

Must File Declarations By Sept 15

Individual taxpayers who file declarations of estimated Federal income tax returns must pay the second installment of tax due on their 1966 estimates by Thursday, September 15, 1966. A. M. Stroepfer, Detroit District Director of Internal Revenue for Michigan, said that taxpayers whose anticipated income during 1966 has changed may be required to file an amended declaration of estimated tax. A blank form for use as an amended declaration of estimates is printed on the back of the bill which the Internal Revenue Service sends individuals for an installment of estimated tax, Mr. Stroepfer said. Form 1040-ES (Amended) also may be obtained from any Internal Revenue Service office. Document No 5111, which furnishes more details on this subject, may be furnished many who write for it to the District Director Internal Revenue Service, Detroit, Michigan.

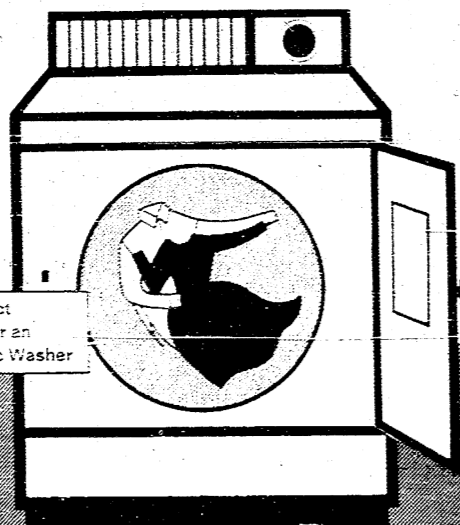

CONGRESSMAN VIVIAN TO HOLD POLLUTION HEARINGS

Congressman Weston Vivian of the second district has announced that the water pollution hearings to be held by the House Natural Resources Subcommittee of the Committee on Government Operations originally scheduled for August 5 in Toledo, will be held on Friday, September 9 and Saturday, Sept. 10. The hearings will take place at the auditorium of the Chamber of Commerce Building at 218 Huron Street, Toledo, Ohio. The subcommittee is continuing a series of hearings which have recently taken them to such places as Rochester, New York. The purpose of the hearings is to determine what industrial, civic, and state organizations are doing to cope with the problems of water pollution, and in this instance, specifically with respect to Western Lake Erie and its tributaries, including the Raisin River. I know of no finer way to build for a better tomorrow than by training our youth in the sound American heritage of thrift."
