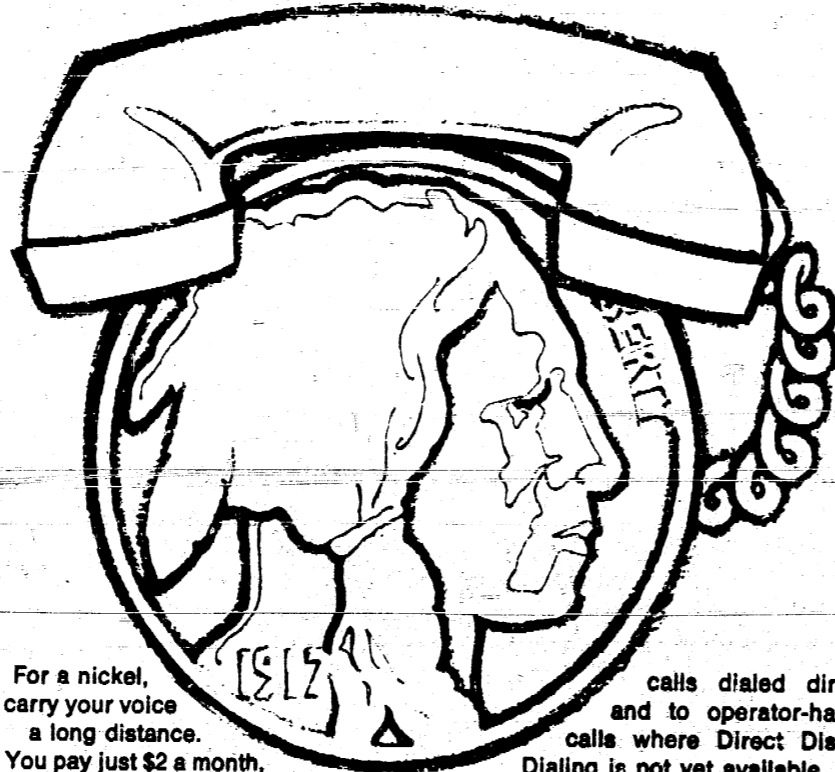

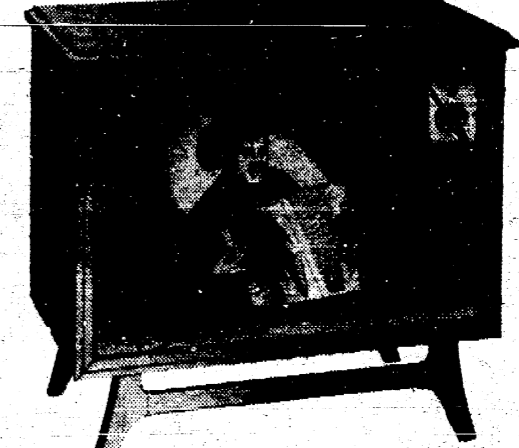
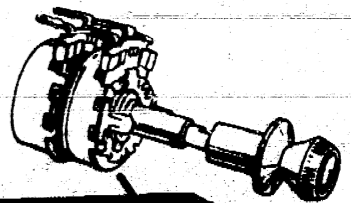

### Work Accidents

NEW YORK—The number of work injuries and deaths per 100,000 workers has been dropping steadily in the past 25 years, says the Insurance Information Institute. In 1968, with an employed labor force of 75.9 million persons, 14,300 persons were killed, approximately 19 out of every 100,000 workers. This was about 36 per cent lower than the 1941 rate of 29.6 deaths per 100,000 workers.

### Riot Losses

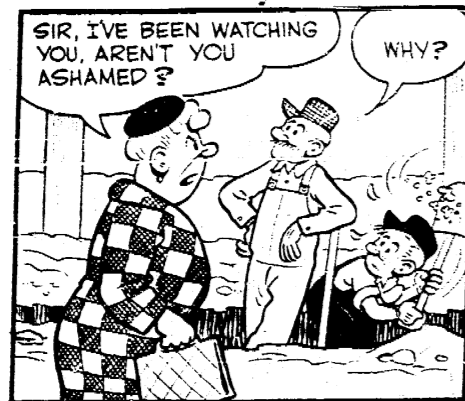
NEW YORK—Civil disorders and riots in 1968 hit 361 cities in 37 states, and the District of Columbia, according to the Insurance Information Institute. The upheavals, chiefly occurring in early April following the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., caused more than \$78 million in insured losses. The hardest-hit city was Washington, D. C., where losses totaled some \$21 million.

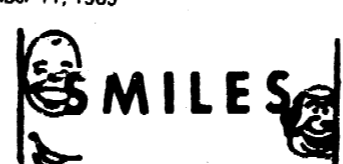
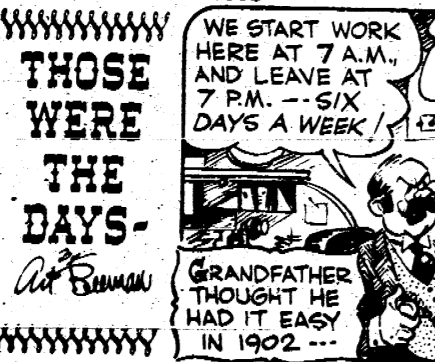
### LOOKING AROUND

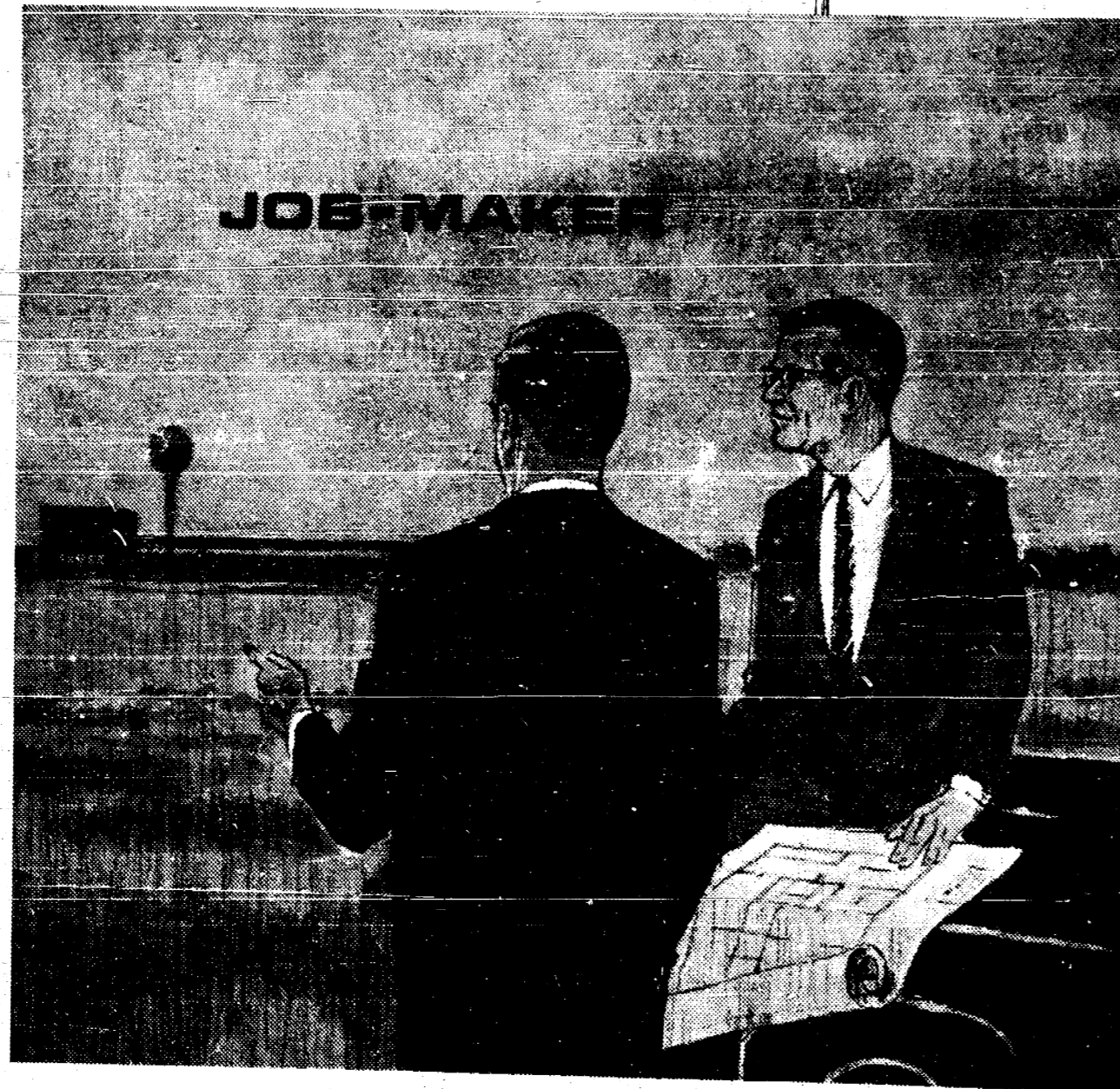

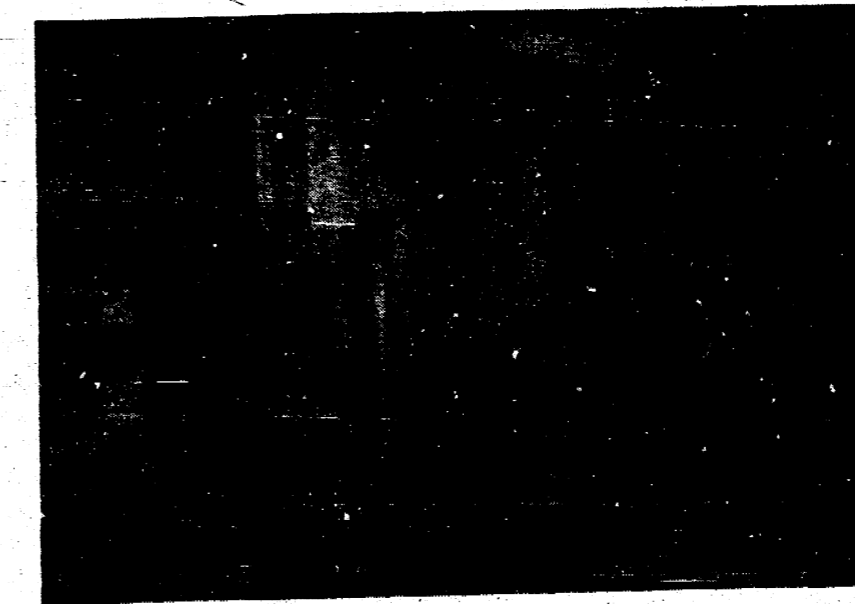

### BARBERS LAUDED FOR EFFORTS

At their last meeting, members of the Washtenaw County Barber's Union, Local No. 689, were presented with a Certificate of Recognition by the Kidney Foundation of Michigan. The presentation was made to William Boatwright by Miss Phyllis Carty of the Foundation in thanks for the barbers' contribution to the Melvin "Red" Lamb Memorial Trick or Treat Halloween candy sale.

Mr. Lamb was a former member of the Union, and after removal of both kidneys in March 1966, underwent a kidney transplant in December of that year. He died in May, 1969, and as a memorial to him, the local Union sold over one ton of Trick or Treat Candy. They grossed \$2,064.36, of which the net profit for the Foundation's Drug Program is \$1,032.18.

This profit will support drugs needed for twenty nephrotic children or for one and one-quarter transplant patients for a full year's time.



The Village of Manchester's iron removal plant was put into service March 1, 1969. The plant has had a total production to this time of 57,753,000 gallons of finished water. Usage per month of finished water totals 7,219,000 gallons. The new storage tank has increased the pressure in the water mains by 20 lbs. The system was also increased by the installation of 700 lin. feet of 6 inch water main.

Here is how the new skating rink is coming. Flooding is now going on. The rink is located under the new building on the Athletic Field. The rink is being flooded by the Public Works Department.
