Token Lots for Kirk Park To Be Sold at Manchester Fair

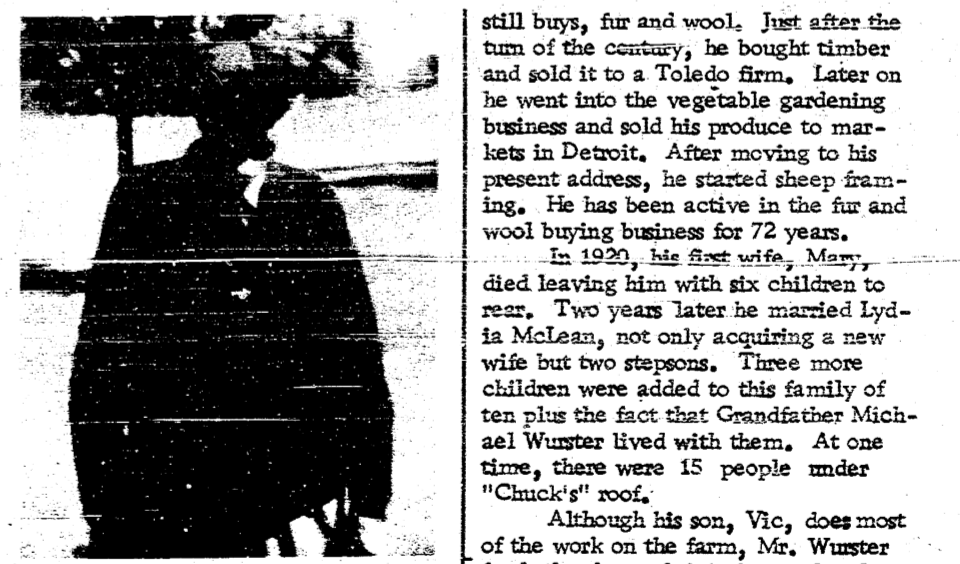


Token Lots for Kirk Park To Be Sold at Manchester Fair
