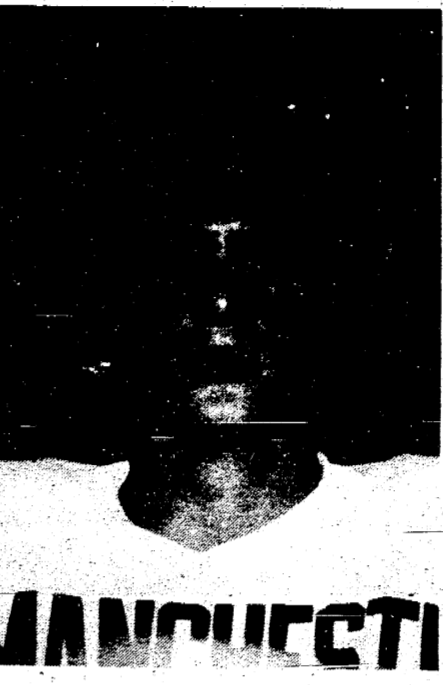

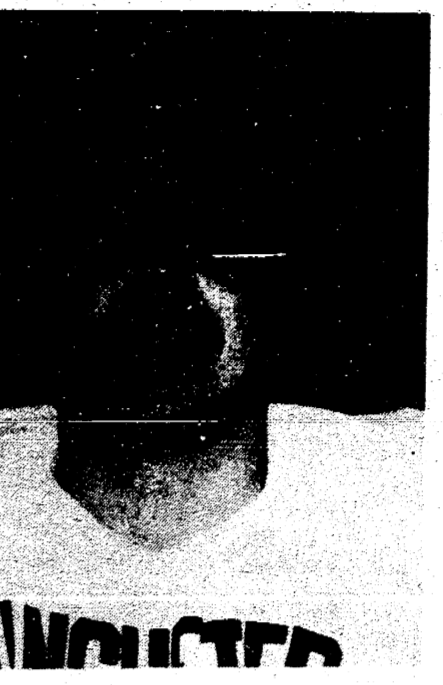

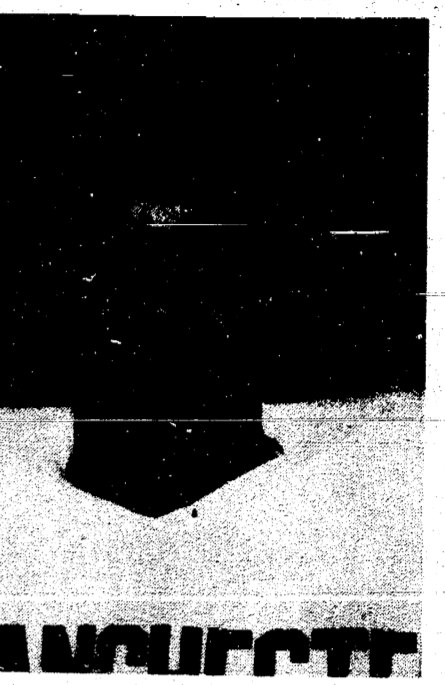

Again the "Dutch" were tagged with numerous penalties: 400 yd in 3 games. We will have to change here or we will get ourselves into trouble.

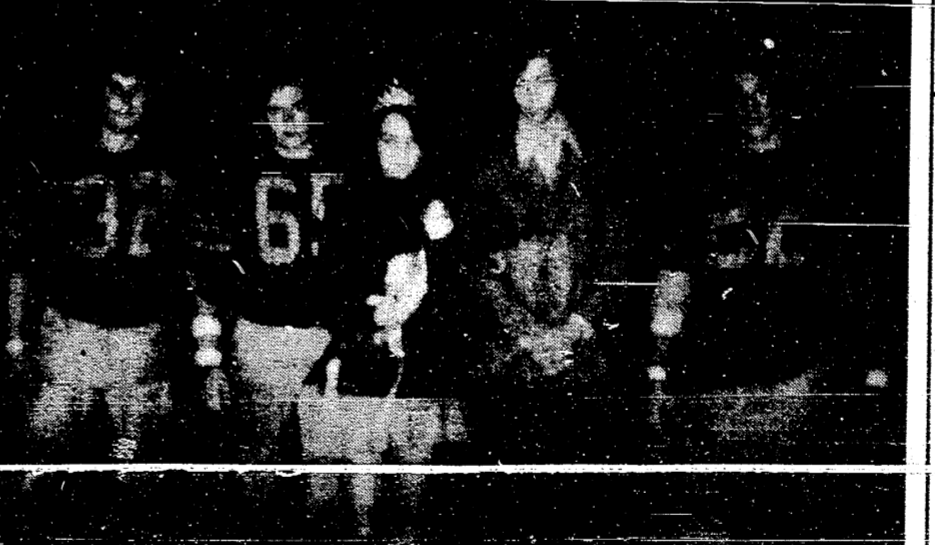

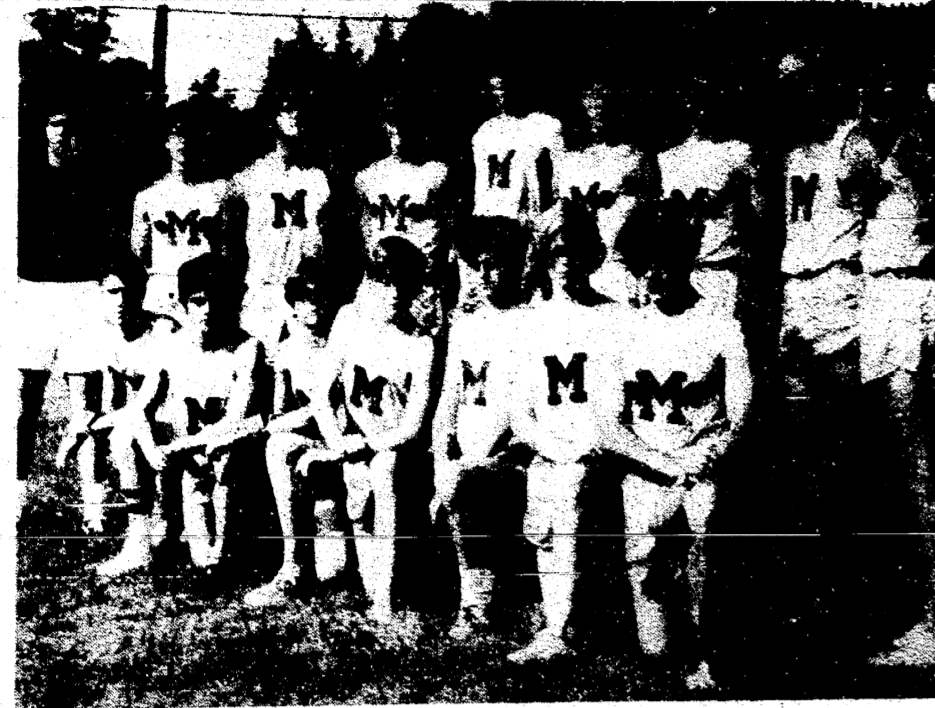

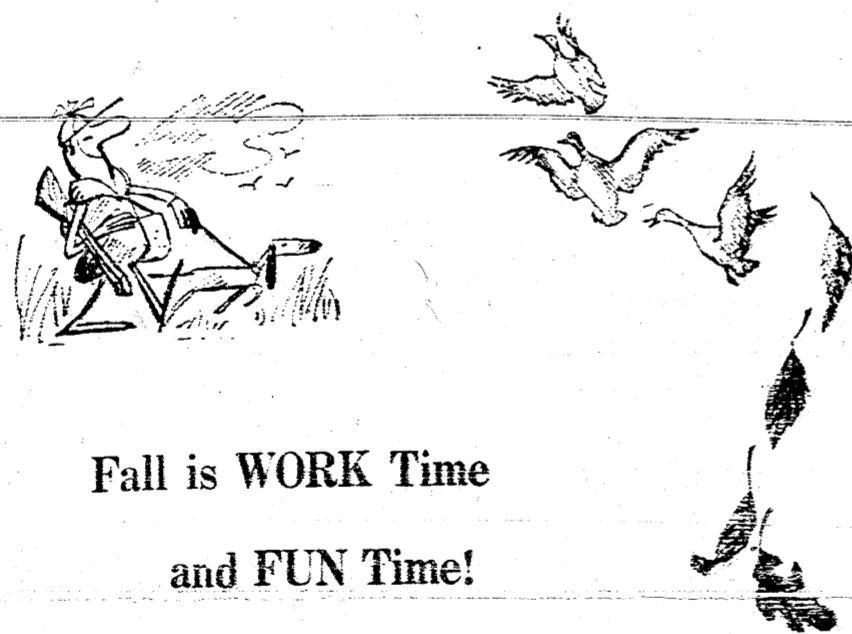

New Look for Cross-Country Team

This year's Manchester High Cross Country team features the "new" look. "New" in that they have a new coach (Larry Steeb, former M.S.U. trackman), a new course (at Luther Klager Elementary School), and hopefully a new outlook from last year (which saw the team go through the entire season without a conference win.) So far this fall the team has shown the potential to improve on last year's record, but still has found itself on the losing side of 15-47 and 20-30 scores against last year's championship Addison team and against Onsted. In cross-country the lower score wins. This year's team has been led so far by Junior Co-Captain Jeff Bruestle, Junior Jose Arana, and sophomore John Roberts. All three have shown fine potential which should speak well for next year's team. Senior Manuel

Freshmen Joel Tobias and sophomore Dave Benedict round out the varsity seven. If these boys should falter Junior Delrus Wolff, Sophomore's Bob Yoakum and Tom Guenther have all shown varsity potential. Completing this year's roster at the Jr. Varsity level are sophomores Brad Frey, John Savage, Darrel Krauss, Russ Aiuto and senior Mark Chapin. We were much concerned after reading Mrs. Janofski's letter in last week's Enterprise. As she suggested my wife and I have checked the reading assignments given our daughters who are in the ninth and tenth grades. We have also checked with the school administration, and have received the book lists used in the literature courses. Unfortunately, Mrs. Janofski did not cite titles and authors in her letter, nor have we read every book on the lists furnished. We would, however, be quite pleased if our daughters would make the effort to read every book on these lists.

The authors are all recognized for their contributions to literature and none have been charged with anything like smut peddling, etc. Some of the books are very factual and tell it like it is, without any attempt to excite or arouse the more basic instincts.

We have learned that the literature courses are elective and the student can reject any book he or his family may find offensive. The books on the lists are approved for secondary school use by the American Library Association, the National Association of Independent Schools, the Library Journal, The Saturday Review, and the National Council of Teacher's of English.

It is most refreshing to see the curriculum expand in our school system, giving our children more opportunity to develop their interests and capabilities. Maybe space can be made in the next issue of the school report card to publish the book lists and authors, as well as a listing of required and elective high school courses.
