EXTENDED SERVICE FOR LATE FILERS

Taxpayers in the Ann Arbor area are being offered a special eleventh hour service by Internal Revenue this weekend and next. For the first time in many years the IRS office here will be open on Saturdays and also Monday evenings to provide service to late filing taxpavers, according to Thomas A.

Cardoza, IRS District Director. The IRS office at 3430 Washtenaw Street in Ann Arbor and 13 other locations around the State will be open Saturday, April 8, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and Monday, April 10, till 8:00 p.m. Mr. Cardoza said taxpayer service will be offered again during the same hours next Saturday and Monday, April 15 and 17. The deadline for filing Federal Tax returns this year

is April 17. Telephone assistance continues to be offered five days a week, Monday through Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. at major IRS offices around the state. In addition IRS telephone lines will be open during the extended Saturday and Monday evening hours of ser-

vice, according to Cardoza. Mr. Cardoza said that this extended Taxpayer Service program is in accord with Internal Revenue's belief that most taxpayers can prepare their own Federal tax return without having to pay for professional help. He also stated that the additional hours of service are intended to help persons who have been unable to use IRS services because their daily work hours coincide

with normal IRS office hours. Taxpavers visiting IRS offices are requested to bring with them the tax forms package sent to them by mail. However. forms are also available at IRS offices.

The pay of a buck private hit the 100-a-week mark on January 1, announced pergeant Dallas Landrem, the local Army recruiter in Ann Arbor.

The figure reflects the military's third salary increase in 12 months, and represents an across-the-board 5.5 percent hike to cover increases in the cost of living. Seven weeks ago - the day the wage freeze ended - Congress boosted the pay of servicemen. Those boosts, weighted in favor of the lower ranking officers and enlisted men, were designed to attract enough volunteers so that it would not be necessary to renew the President's draft authority when it expires on June 30. 1973.

"The pay raise is the 10th in eight years," said Sergeant Landrem. And it has really changed the complexion of the military." For example: "30 months ago the basic pay of the new recruit was \$120.00 a month. On January 1 it became

The basic pay does not really give a true picture of the military salary excounded the sergeant. Servicemen also receive additional housing and subsistence allowances which are nontaxable. This means that an average new recruit now receives \$5,140.00 a year, \$2,000.00 more than received two months and two

For the highest ranking sergeant, a sergeant major, average pay now stands at \$15,184 a year, up more than \$1,700 over the two months. "Of course these are just average pay scales," said the sergeant. "The actual

pay varies with the number of years in service as well as rank." Sergeant Landrem concluded by stating, that in addition to the pay scales mentioned, there are 128 other benefits and allowances for which servicemen may be eligible. ELECTOR UNABLE TO MAKE PERSONAL APPLICATION, PROCEDURE

SEC. 504. Any elector who is unable to make personal application for registration because of physical disability or absence from the Township, City of Village in which his legal residence is located, may be registered prior to the close of registration before any election or primary election by securing from the Clerk of the Township, City or Village in which is located his legal residence, duplicate registration cards and executing in duplicate the registration affidavit before a notary public or other officer legally authorized to administer oaths and returning such registration cards to the Clerk of the Township, City or Village before the close of office hours on the last day of registration prior to any election or primary election. The notary public or other officer administering the oath shall sign his name on the line for the signature of the registration officer and designate his title.

UNREGISTERED PERSONS NOT ENTITLED TO VOTE

SEC. 491. The inspectors of election at any election or primary election in this State, or in any District, County, Township, City or Village thereof, shall not receive the vote of any person whose name is not registered in the registration book of the Township, Ward or Precinct in which he offers to vote. (As provided under Act 116, P. A. 1954.)

TRANSFER OF REGISTRATION, APPLICATION, TIME

SEC. 506. Any registered elector may upon change of residence within the Township, City of Village cause his registration to be transferred to his new address by sending to the Clerk a signed request, storing his present address, the date he moved thereto, and the address from which he was last registered, or by applying in person for a transfer. The Clerk shall strike through the last address, ward and precinct number and record the new address, ward and precinct number on the original and duplicate registration cards, and shall place the original registration card in proper precinct file. Such transfers shall not be made after the Fifth Friday next preceding any election or primary election, unless such Fifth Friday shall fall on a legal holiday in which event registration transfers shall be accepted during the following day.

TRANSFER OF REGISTRATION ON ELECTION DAY

SEC. 507. Any registered elector who has removed from one election precinct of a Township, City or Village to another election precinct of the same Township, City or Village and has not recorded such removal with the local Clerk shall execute a transfer of registration request, listing the new residence address thereon over his signature, with the election board in the precinct in which he is registered at the next ensuing primary or election. The inspector of election in charge of the registration records shall compare the signature thereon with the signature upon the applicant is registration record and, if the signatures correspond, then the inspector shall certify such fact by affizing his initials upon said request. The applicant for transfer, after having signed an application to verte as provided in Section 523 of this act, shall then be permitted to vote in such precinct for that primary or election why. The application for transfer shall be filled with the Township, City or Village Clerk who shall transfer such voter's registration in accordance with the application. When the name of any street in a Township, City or Village has been changed, it shall be the duty of the Township, City or Village Clerk to make the change to show the proper name of street in the registration records, and it shall not be necessary for the elector to change his registration with respect thereto in order to be eligible to vote.






