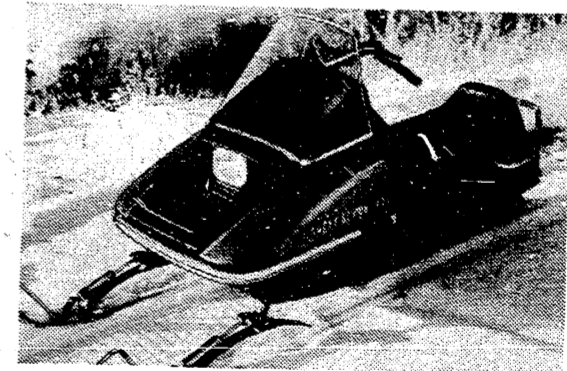

TRUCK WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS

The Washtenaw County Road Commission deems it necessary to preserve the roads under the jurisdiction of this Board and by virtue of the applicable sections of the Michigan Vehicle Code being Act 300, Public Acts of 1949 as amended, we impose springtime axle load restrictions effective 6 a. m. Thursday, January 24, 1974. The allowable truck loadings are as follows:

MAXIMUM ALLOWABLE GROSS AXLE LOADINGS		
Spacing Between Axles	Concrete	Black Top & Gravel
9 feet or over	13,500 lbs.	11,700 lbs.
More than 3 1/2 feet, but less than 9 feet	9,750 lbs.	8,450 lbs.
When less than 3 1/2 feet the combined weight shall not exceed	13,500 lbs.	11,700 lbs.
Maximum load on any wheel shall not exceed: (pounds per inch of tire width)	525 lbs.	450 lbs.

MAXIMUM TRUCK SPEED

No truck, tractor or tractor with trailer, nor any combination of such vehicles with a gross weight loaded or unloaded in excess of 5,000 pounds shall exceed a speed of 45 miles per hour, which shall be reduced to 35 miles per hour during the period when reduced loadings are being enforced.



Internal Revenue Service offices will be open the next two Saturdays, February 2 and February 9, to furnish taxpayers in-person assistance with their 1973 Federal tax returns. Assistors will be on duty between 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. at all 29 of the permanently-staffed IRS offices in Michigan, according to District Director Thomas A.

Cardozo. After February 9, assistance will not be offered again on Saturdays until March 30, Cardozo said. IRS offers in-person assistance weekdays at most offices from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Telephone service to taxpayers, however, will be offered every Saturday, according to Cardozo. Telephone assistors will answer queries from 10:00 a.m. till 3:30 p.m. every Saturday, even on those days that offices are closed for in-person service, Cardozo said. in the tax instruction booklets. 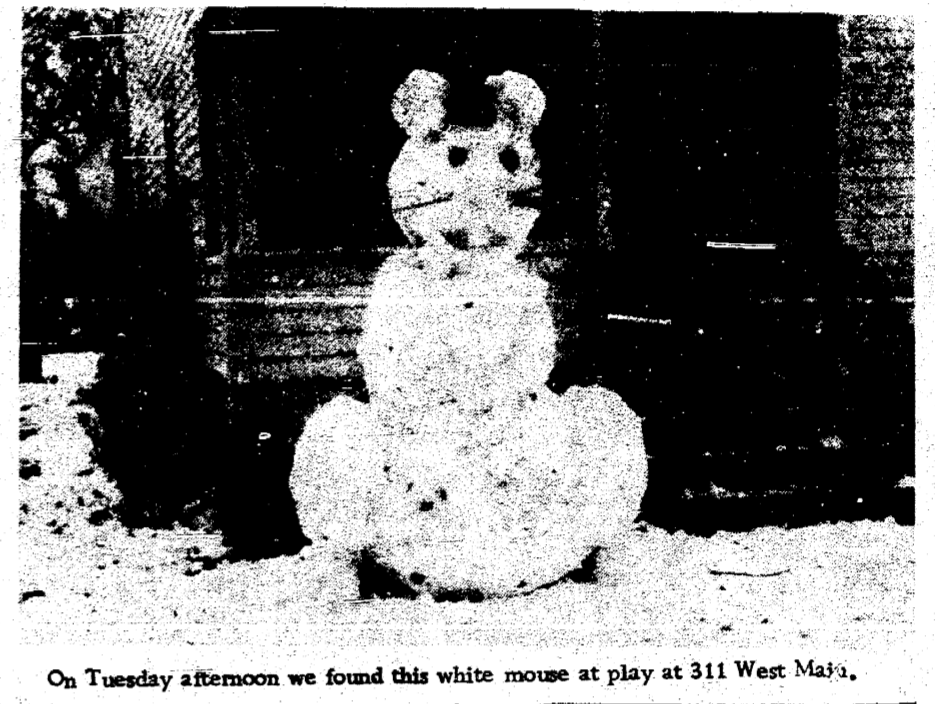
ELECTOR UNABLE TO MAKE PERSONAL APPLICATION, PROCEDURE SEC. 504. Any elector who is unable to make personal application for registration because of physical disability or absence from the Township, City or Village in which his legal residence is located, may be registered prior to the close of registration before any election or primary election by securing from the Clerk of the Township, City or Village in which is located his legal residence, duplicate registration cards and executing or duplicate the registration affidavit before a notary public or other officer legally authorized to administer oaths and returning such registration cards to the Clerk of the Township, City or Village before the close of office hours on the last day of registration prior to any election or primary election. The notary public or other officer administering the oath shall sign his name on the line for the signature of the registration officer and designate his title.

UNREGISTERED PERSONS NOT ENTITLED TO VOTE SEC. 491. The inspector of election at any election or primary election in this State, or in any District, County, Township, City or Village thereof, shall not receive the vote of any person whose name is not registered in the registration book of the Township, Ward or Precinct in which he offers to vote. (As provided under Act 116, P. A. 1954.)

TRANSFER OF REGISTRATION, APPLICATION, TIME SEC. 506. Any registered elector may upon change of residence within the Township, City or Village cause his registration to be transferred to his new address by sending to the Clerk a signed request, stating his present address, the date he moved thereto, and the address from which he was last registered, or by applying in person for a transfer. The inspector of election in charge of the registration records shall compare the signature thereon with the signature upon the applicant's registration record and, if the signatures correspond, then the inspector shall certify such fact by affixing his initials upon said request. The applicant for transfer, after having signed an application to vote as provided in Section 503 of this act, shall then be permitted to vote in such precinct for that primary or election only. The application for transfer shall be filed with the Township, City or Village Clerk who shall transfer such voter's registration in accordance with the application. When the name of any street in a Township, City or Village has been changed, it shall be the duty of the Township, City or Village Clerk to make the change to show the proper name in the registration records, and it shall not be necessary for the elector to change his registration with respect thereto in order to be eligible to vote.
