LETTERS TO THE EDITOR



To the Taxpayers of Manchester Township

Michigan statute requires that the assessing officer review the assessments in their jurisdiction as of December 31 annually. It is the legal responsibility of the assessing officer to assess everyone at 50% of market value as of this date.

The County Board of Commissioners, also in compliance with State statutes, reviews the assessment rolls of all units of government within the county. This review is performed by the Board of Commissioners through the Equalization Department. The Equalization Department is required by law to publish tentative factors for all taxing units so they are aware of the adjustments necessary to bring their assessments to 50% of value as of December 31st. If the County Board

of Commissioners does not equate every unit of government to 50% of value, the State Tax Commission adds a value on the county and each local unit of government must then take its proportionate share of this increase. The Equalization Department of Washtenaw County has made a study of both real and personal property in Manchester Township and issued a real tentative factor of 1.06 and personal property factor of 1.05. A factor of 1.00 means an assessing unit is assessing at 50% of value.

Manchester Township's factor indicates that 6% must be added to the real property rolls and 5% to the personal property assessments to bring them to 50% of value as of December 31, 1974. As your supervisor and assessing officer I will, therefore, be required to make adjustments in the 1975 assessment roll. These rolls will be open for inspection by the public at the Township Hall when the Board of Review convenes in March 1975. Notice of said Board of Review indicating time and dates will be published in the local newspaper.

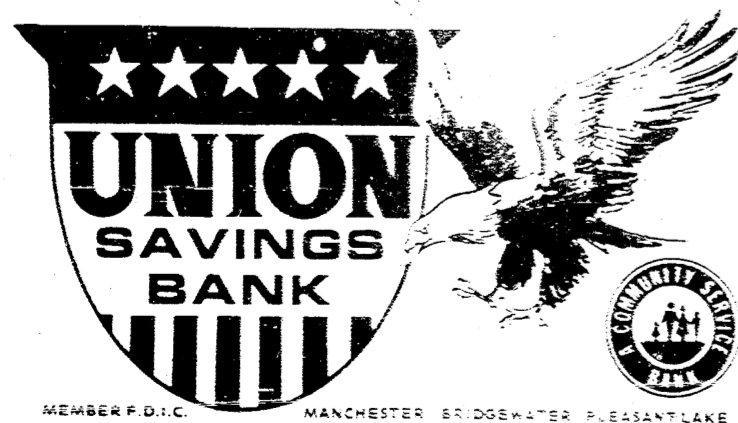

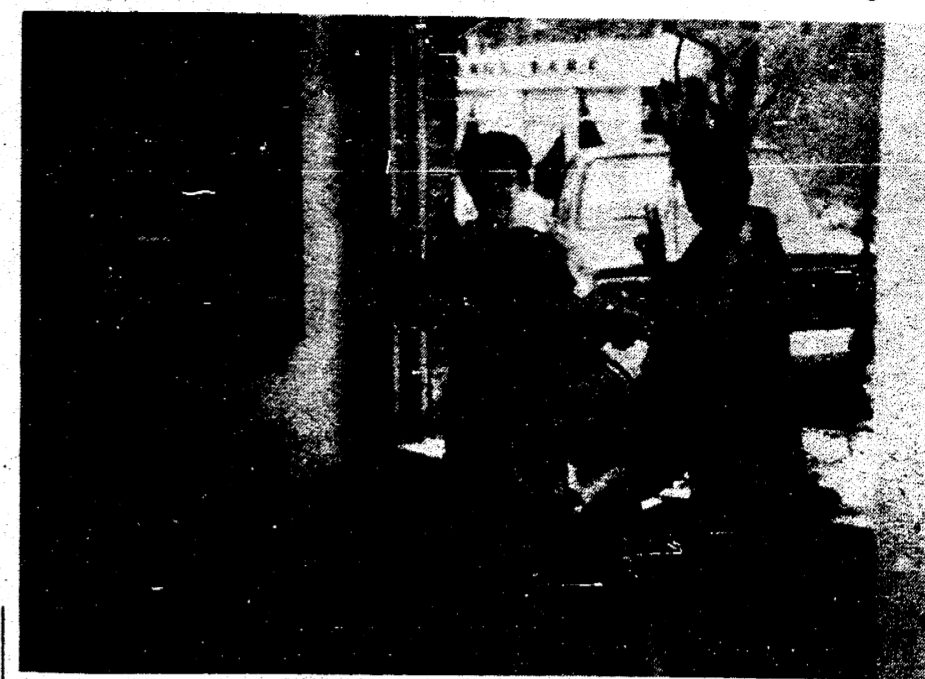

On display are a few of the various crafts the scouts have been working on throughout the year.

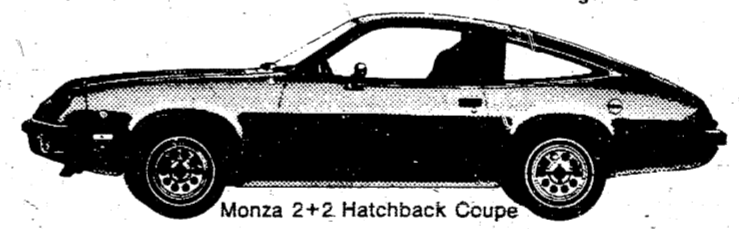

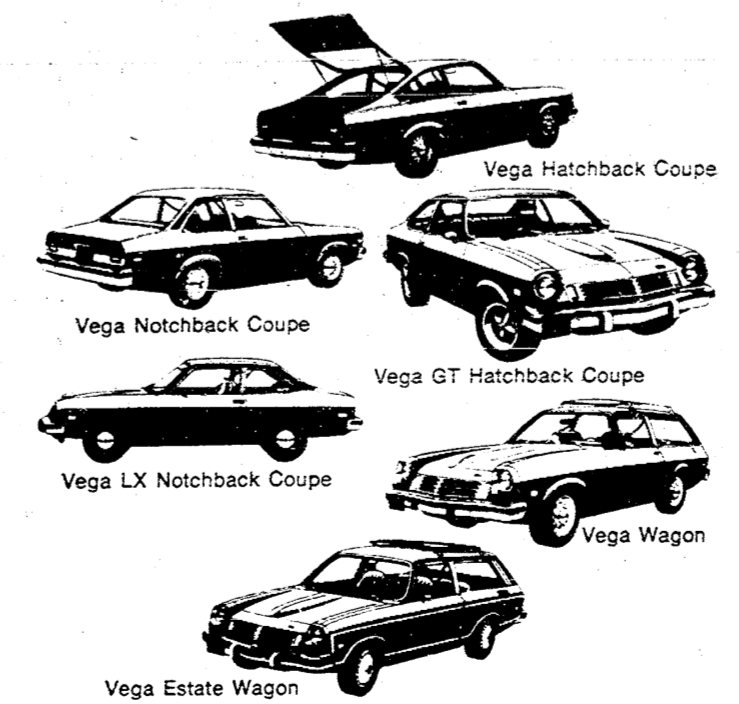

Manchester wasn't effected by Clinton's home court as it was the Redskins that couldn't get the ball to drop as the Little Dutch roared to a 20 to 6 first period advantage. The second period saw both squads add 20 to their tallies, so the score at halftime stood 40-26 Manchester.

The third period was rather slow offensively, as Manchester totaled 14 points while Clinton added 11 points to close the third period with Manchester up 17, 54-37. The fourth period was very interesting because Manchester was ahead by 23 points when Clinton got hot to cut the lead to 10 points before Manchester woke up to raise their favor to 16 points. But it wasn't over as once again Clinton switched the momentum to pull within 9 points, but there just wasn't enough time as Manchester hit some free throws to put the game away, 77-64.

Mark Rutherford was high scorer hitting for 17 points, while Curt Fielder trailed by 1, popping 16. Randy Bennett and Greg Daniels contributed 12 points each. Greg was high rebounder as he grabbed 13 with Matt Little and Randy snatching 9 apiece.

Statistically speaking, Manchester totaled 52 rebounds, 11 steals, 18 assists, 19 turnovers and 10 players scored.

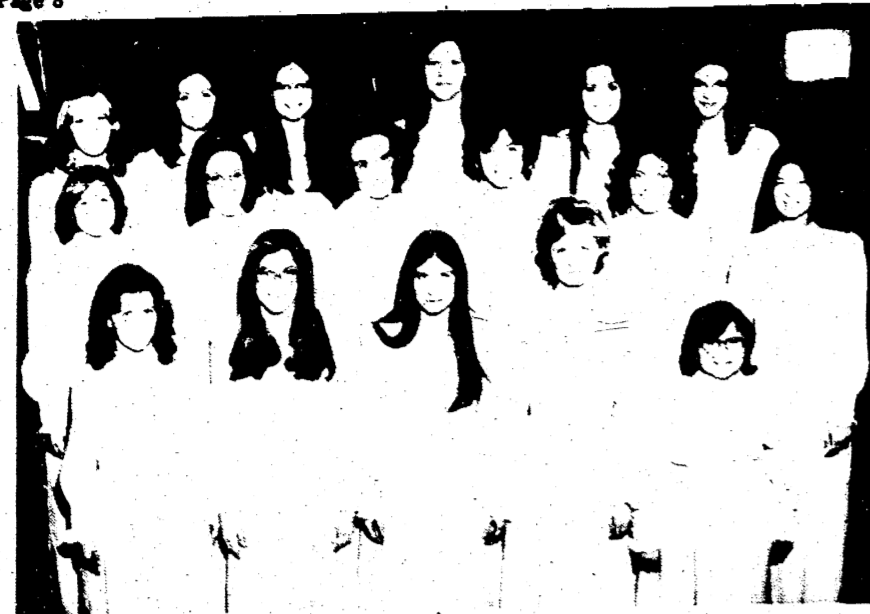

Produced for the Auca Missionary Foundation, narrated by Betty Elliot, from whose books, Through Gates of Splendor and The Savage, My Kinsman, the story was taken, this is one of the most remarkable missionary films ever made.

In addition, Ann Arbor Federal Savings also offers the new Individual Retirement Account for those who now are employed by a company that does not offer a pension plan. Maximum tax deferred yearly deposit allowed is \$1500. IRA pension plans can be arranged for an individual or for an entire corporation.

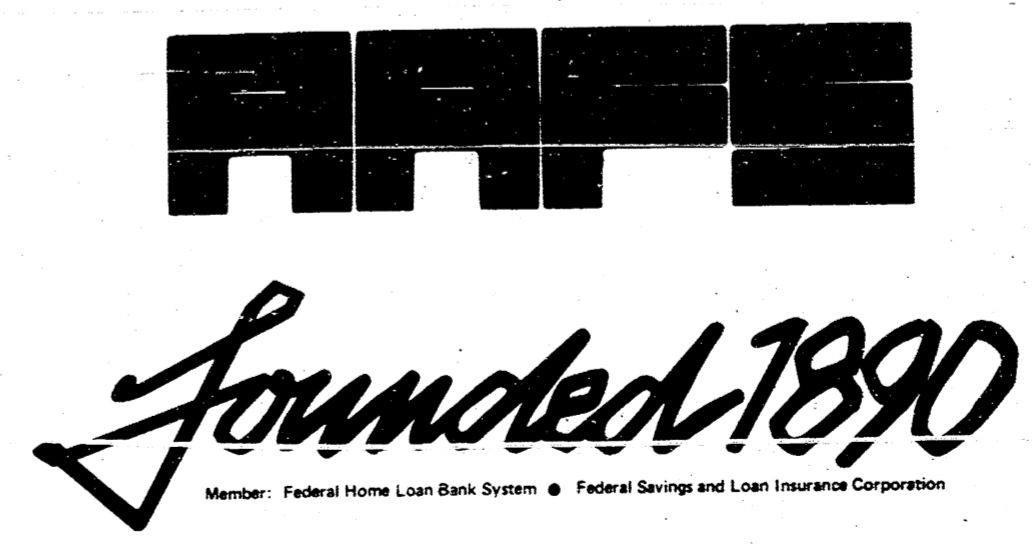
