**STATE SCHOOL AID MONIES**

Checks representing the February 1 installment of state school aid monies have been mailed to local school districts in Jackson and Washtenaw Counties, State Representative Michael H. Conlin (R-Jackson) today reported.

Conlin pointed out that payments representing the state membership aid to local districts and Title I, Title III and

vocational education payments are mailed to school districts six times a year. The school district for Washtenaw County and amounts received are as follows: Milan Area Schools, \$206,169 in membership aid, \$12,500 in Title I funds and \$1,329 in vocational education funds.

Ann Arbor Public Schools, \$111,760 in membership aid, \$25,000 in Title I funds, \$73,082 in Title III funds and \$41,524 in vocational education funds.

Whitmore Lake Public Schools, \$70,904 in membership aid, \$781 in vocational education funds.

Chelsea School District, \$61,230 in membership aid, \$8,470 in Title I funds and \$256 for vocational education.

Manchester Public Schools, \$54,820 in membership aid, \$4,586 in Title I funds and \$474 for vocational education.

Saline Area Schools, \$51,000 in membership aid, \$1,226 for Title I and \$1,490 for vocational education.

# Agriculture in Action

Michigan Farm Bureau

One of the most misguided ideas going around the country is that Americans have some sort of right to cheap food.

Granted, it would be nice to have all sorts of food handed to us on a silver platter, but this can not be if we are going to continue to eat well. The horn of plenty cannot continue to have nourishing food coming forth from it if there is no incentive at the producing end to keep it coming.

Ever since time began, man has had to work hard to earn his food supply. In many nations of the world today, man work just as hard as he did 2,000 years ago, but still he and his family go hungry. In some countries, over half the income of a family goes for food, while here in America, we buy our food for less than 16 percent of our take home pay.

Americans have been spoiled with cheap food prices over the past 30 years. The percentage of our take home pay that we spend for food has continued to drop to the present level, which is the lowest in the world. Because we have spent less, percentage-wise, we have more to spend on some of the better things of life such as stereos, dishwashers, vacations, and college educations for our children.

Farmers would like these things for their families, too. Many of them have worked hard and do have these things. Others have worked just as hard and do not have them, because they have different type farming operations and all farming enterprises do not yield the same returns.

What upsets farmers is to see headlines that proclaim good news when farm prices go down, because it may indicate lower food prices. What consumers should understand is that you cannot have high farm prices and low food prices. If farmers are going to survive and do well, farm prices must go up and stay up. Only farmers produce food...not President Ford, or Earl Butz, or members of the Congress. And the only way farmers will continue to produce food for very long is to have an incentive to do so, and that incentive is a price high enough to give them a net income as good as what they would have if they were working in industry.

### Bake a Perfect Lemon Pie

One way to be sure that lemon pie will have the just-right consistency every time, is to remember to stir the lemon juice into the corn starch thickened mixture very gently and only after cooking is completed.

#### Lemon Meringue Pie

- 1 baked 9-inch pastry shell
- 1 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup Argo corn starch
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 1/2 cups water
- 3 eggs, separated
- 2 tablespoons margarine
- 1 1/2 teaspoons grated lemon rind
- 1/2 cup lemon juice

Mix 1/4 cup of the sugar, corn starch and salt in double boiler top. Gradually stir in water. Cook over boiling water, stirring constantly, until thick enough to mound slightly when dropped from spoon. Cover; cook 10 minutes longer, stirring occasionally. Do not remove from boiling water. Mix together egg yolks and remaining 1/4 cup sugar. Blend a little hot mixture into egg yolk mixture, then stir all into remaining hot mixture over boiling water. Cook 2 minutes, stirring constantly. Remove from boiling water. Gently stir in margarine, lemon rind and juice. Cool to room temperature without stirring. Turn into baked pastry shell. Cover with meringue made from the egg whites and 6 tablespoons sugar. Bake in 425°F oven about 5 minutes or until lightly browned. Cool at room temperature away from drafts.

## HUMANE SOCIETY OF HURON VALLEY

The Humane Society of Huron Valley announces March 3rd as the opening date of its new spay and neuter clinic which adjoins the present shelter located at 3100 Cherry Hill Road.

Heading the clinic will be a veterinarian who is a 1971 honor graduate of Michigan State University School of Veterinary Medicine and is affiliated with the American Veterinary Medicine Association and the Michigan Veterinary Association.

A veterinary technician who is also a Michigan State University graduate with four years experience will be assisting the Veterinarian.

The clinic was established to provide birth control by spaying and neutering pets at the lowest cost possible to the public, thereby reducing the number of unwanted puppies and kittens. This is a specialized clinic designed specifically for spaying and neutering; sick and injured animals should be taken to a private veterinarian or pet hospital.

The ideal time to spay a female dog or cat is before she reaches maturity in about the sixth month. For neutering a male dog or cat the best time is about nine months of age.

The eligibility requirements for spaying or neutering are: (1) All females must be six months of age or older; (2) All males must be seven months of age or older; (3) all dogs must be licensed prior to surgery and (4) no female will be spayed when pregnant, in heat or is nursing.

The cost for female dogs and cats for spay surgery is \$18.00. Neutering of

male dogs and cats is \$12.00. For appointments and information call the spay and neuter clinic at 693-8965 Monday thru Friday from 10:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. beginning March 3.

## Ask Senator GRIFFIN



By cutting through red tape, members of Congress can often lend a hand to those with problems involving the federal government. I understand that interest rates on Government insured mortgages have been lowered recently. Can you tell me what the rate is now and what that means for the average home buyer?

—F. L. Warren

The maximum allowable interest rate for mortgages insured by the Federal Housing Administration was lowered from 9 to 8 1/2% in January. A similar decrease was ordered in the maximum rate for GI home mortgage loans. Of course, that means lower costs for home buyers. For example, for the person who assumes a \$30,000 mortgage the reduced rate will save \$10.80 on his monthly payments.

When interest rates move down, it generally signals that more mortgage money is available. And that means more people will be able to build or buy homes—which, in turn, provides important stimulus for the economy as a whole.

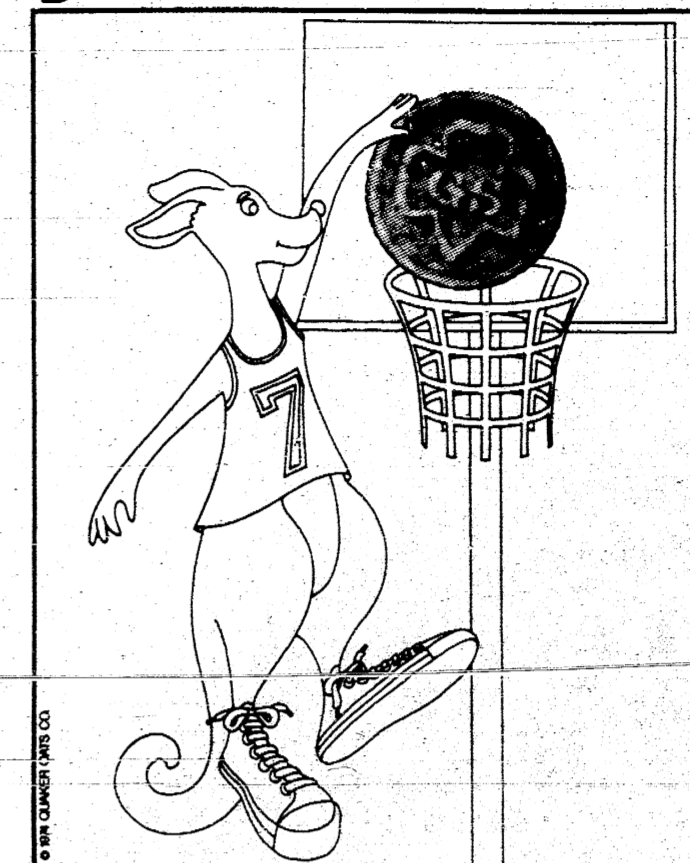
I was so glad that Congress finally did something about pension reform. Where can I find out more about how these changes in the pension law affect me?

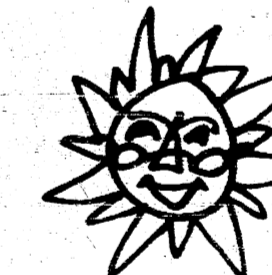

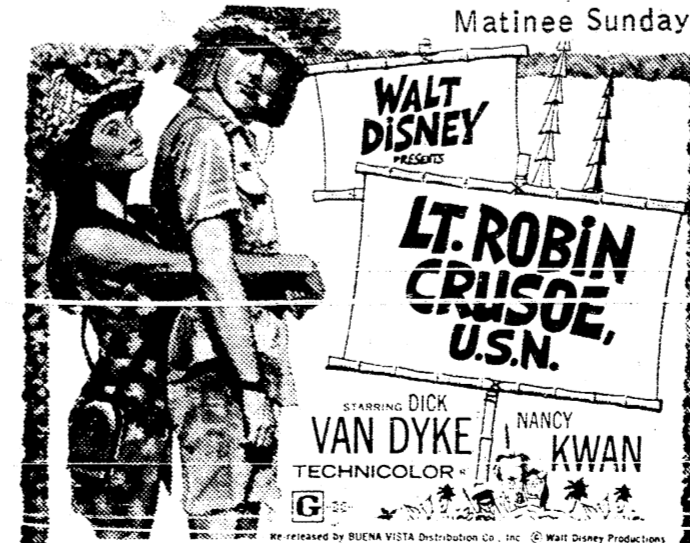
