





An example would be Senator John Tower, Texas' "senior Senator," who is a few years younger than the "junior Senator" of that State, Senator Lloyd Bentsen. Senator Tower entered the Senate in 1961 while Senator Bentsen began his term in 1971.

In Michigan, Senator Hart is regarded as the "senior Senator" because he entered the Senate in 1959. I did not begin my service in the Senate until 1966, making me

the "junior Senator" from Michigan.
