FOOD STAMP REFORM NECESSARY

Participation in the U.S. Food Stamp Program has increased sixfold in the last six years as more and more people indulge in a give-away scheme that should be reserved for those who actually need

A bill (H.R. 7887) to permit selfcertification of applicants for food stamps has been approved by the House Agriculture Committee. Under this bill, a three-month authorization to purchase food stamps will be issued to persons who meet the eligibility guidelines and car prove their identity by such credentials as a driver's license or social security card. Welfare officials have 30 days to make a check to verify the data. Existing law requires that the information in the application be verified before the certificate for food stamps is issued.


