Sharon Township Signs Contract With Manchester Police

The Township of Sharon has negotiated a Police Protection Contract with the Village of Manchester.

Allen Alber, Township Supervisor, said their board has reviewed several alternatives in Police Protection options, and believe the agreement worked out with the village will afford the best possible protection for the least possible cost. Mr. Alber pointed out that the township does have Washtenaw County Sheriff Protection, but that it is not satisfactory to fill township residence complete needs, William Zsenyuk, Village Police Chief said the Protection begins immediately and
