

Also, check consumer references for all work. Remember that you never get anything for nothing.

DON'T GIVE YOUR CAR AWAYL .. You can reduce the risk of theft of your unattended car, its parts or contents, by observing these precautions: Always renove your keys and lock your doors and windows. Don't leave valuable items in plain sight. Carry ownership papers on your person rather than in the car. And remember "Always lock it".

Remember, a thief has to "sell" what he takes. Help make it harder for him and easier for police. Mark all your valuables with a Michigan operators license number and use an "operation ID decal" to advertise your marking of your property.

Question: Recently I heard a neighbor mention something called a mandatory special education law. Since I have a ittle boy that I think has some problems, I'm curious to know if the law talks only about mentally retarded kids or if other kinds of handicaps are included. Just what does the law say?

Answer: The Mandatory Special Education Act (Public Act 198 of 1971) has been in effect since the 1973-74 school year. Through this law, the State of Michigan guarantees all children the RIGHT an education, including handicapped children. The mandatory law states that every eligible handicapped public school student is guaranteed an education that has been individually designed to meet his needs.

The State of Michigan defines each condition that makes an individual eligible Grass Lake for Special Education Services. If a student meets the States definition of a handicapping condition, he is eligible for Special Education Services, regardless of how severe his handicap is. Special Education services must be provided to any eligible person from birth through the age of twenty-five or until graduation from high school. The following handicapping conditions are recognized and defined by the State of Michigan: Mental Impairment, Emotional Impairment, Physical and Health Impairments, Homebound and Hospitalized Individuals, Learning Disabilities. Visual Impairment. Hearing Impairment, Speech and Language Impair-
