Therapy Program

The Chelsea Community Hospital announces the initiation of a Summer Speech and Language Therapy Program from July 12-28, 1977. Children from Chelsea, Manchester, Dexter, Whitmore Lake, Pinckney, Gregory, Stockbridge, Grass Lake, Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti with speech and language problems will be accepted for this program. The program will be conducted by Mrs. Gloria B. Nelson, the Speech and Language Pathologist at the Hospital. The program will be held at St. Paul United Church of Christ, 14900 Old US-12, Hospital Volunteers: Maria Valencia, Lisa Radke, Dawn LeMay, Lucy Lindemann and Wendy Varrelmann will be assisting Mrs. Nelson with the program. Parents of children served will be asked to pay a moderate charge for the program; however, no child will be denied services due to inability to pay. Parents will be given the opportunity to observe the therapy and to discuss their child's problems and progress with the clinician.

International Le Leche League

Sandy Winzerm and Joyce Spiess joined 4,000 doctors, nurses and parents with children at a four day Conference which brought together medical experts from all over the world.

"Developing nations could save one billion dollars a year if all their mothers breastfed - a fact which should make La Leche League as powerful as OPEC", Dr. Marshall H. Klaus M.D. author of MATERNAL-INFANT BONDING told the 6th International Conference of LA LECHE LEAGUE INTERNATIONAL in Toronto on Wednesday.

Stressing the beneficial properties inherent in mothers' milk, the noted physician and author, who is professor of Pediatrics at the University Hospitals of Cleveland, cited specific examples in various parts of the globe where babies owe their lives to human milk. "In 1971 and '72 almost 50% of premature babies who developed diarrhea in sections of Argentina were dying from the affliction", Dr. Klaus stated. "In 1973 a system was implemented whereby milk from mothers of full-term babies was supplied to the premises at a teaspoon each lb. of infant weight, and the diarrhea completely stopped!"

La Leche League International is the only international organization in the world whose major purpose is to help women successfully breastfeed their babies. The 21 year old organization started by seven mothers in Franklin Park, Illinois, now has 11,700 leaders directing 3,500 branches in 42 countries.

Also speaking at the seminar, was noted syndicated medical writer, Robert S. Mendelsohn, M.D., Associate Professor of Community Health at the University of Illinois, who, in light of questions raised at recent Senate hearings, about the safety of breast milk, emphasized the medical benefits of nursing over formula feeding. He predicted that within the next 20 years, doctors would become more and more dependent on breast milk.

BREAD PRICES UP; WHEAT PRICES DOWN

The Council on Wage and Price Stability in Washington came to some conclusions recently that shouldn't surprise farmers and consumers. The price of wheat has fallen substantially, but the price of bread has not. In fact, the price of bread has been rising since the third quarter of 1974.

Bread prices, depending on where you shop, are about 35 cents for a one-pound loaf of white bread. Of course, you can pay more for bread with no preservatives, and you can also pay less for store brand bread that's used as a loss leader to get you into the door.

Now figure that you get 70 loaves of white bread from a bushel of wheat. The farm price of wheat is about \$2.50 a bushel. That means the cost of wheat in each one-pound loaf of bread is about three cents. The other 32 cents goes for labor, transportation, packaging, advertising, and profit of course.

Speakers of price, the Wage and Price Council found that major wholesale buyers made a margin of better than 20 percent of their capital invested in bread production. That's good, but the Council does not see it as excessive. Many farmers, on the other hand, lost money on the wheat they planted.

Now the Council does not make any suggestions. It's too bad, maybe they could figure out a way for farmers to get a better return on their investment. The only fix certain, the price of wheat has

very little influence on the price of bread. For that reason, we shouldn't get upset if the farmers get a chance to sell some of their wheat surplus to Russia or other foreign buyers.

Improvements which would attract more riders on the Detroit-Chicago AMTRAK route have been urged by Representative Mike Conlin (D-3rd District).

"I am looking forward to the not-too-distant future when there will be 3-hour rail passenger service between Cobo Hall in downtown Detroit and Union Station in downtown Chicago," Conlin said.

In a letter to National Railroad Passenger Corporation President Paul H. Reistrup, Conlin said that although the State of Michigan is pleased with the progress made so far, "I am convinced we have only scratched the surface as far as ridership potential on this route is concerned."

Conlin sponsored a resolution unanimously adopted in the House and Senate requesting that AMTRAK upgrade the route to improve ridership on the Detroit-Chicago Rail Passenger Corridor.

The Detroit-Chicago route is one of AMTRAK's most successful attempts at developing modern corridor-type inter-city rail services despite the fact the train moves at only 55 mph, Conlin said.

"This route would make an excellent test area for the development of a modern high speed/high frequency rail passenger service.

There is tremendous potential for future expansion—the market area is about 12 million. Two major metropolitan areas are located at both terminals and there are five substantial population areas in between," he explained.

Conlin said that the route has shown greater percentage of passenger growth than any other route in the AMTRAK system.

"I can recall that as Assistant to the Chairman of the National Rail Passenger Corporation in 1971, I was one of many who saw great potential in the Detroit-Chicago route.

TOMATOES-RONI

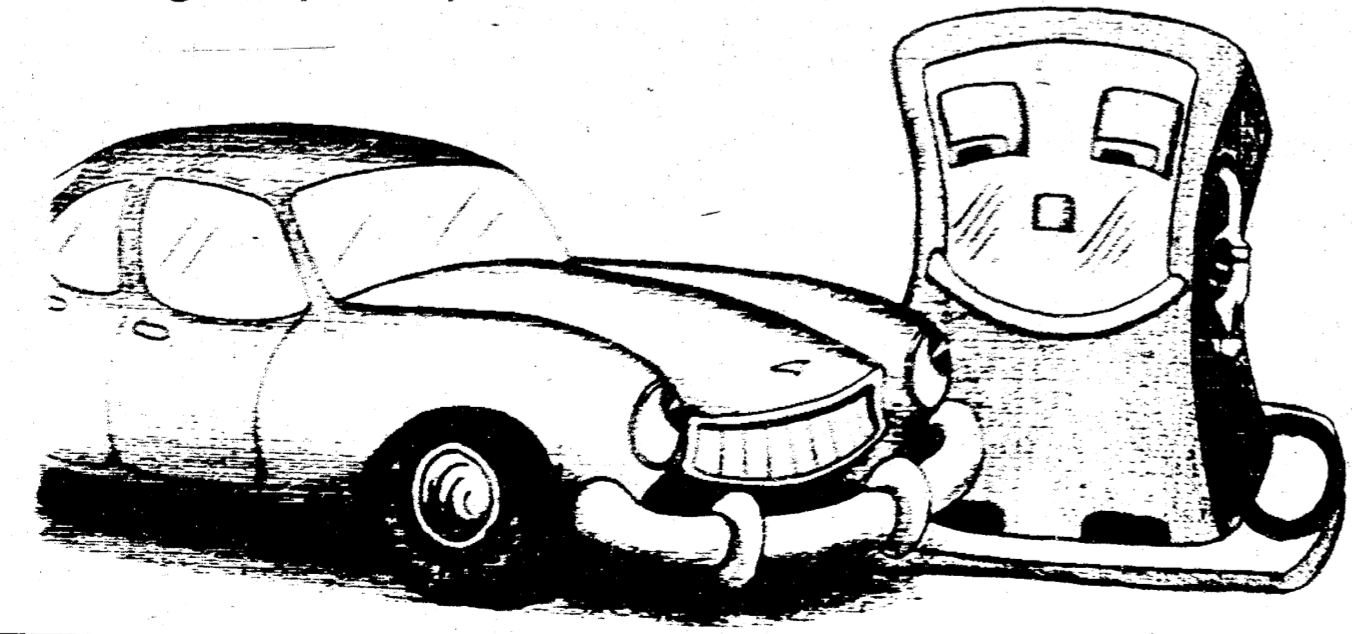
6 large, firm tomatoes

1/2 cup chopped green pepper
1/2 cup chopped celery
2 tablespoons butter or margarine

1 cup crushed corn chips
