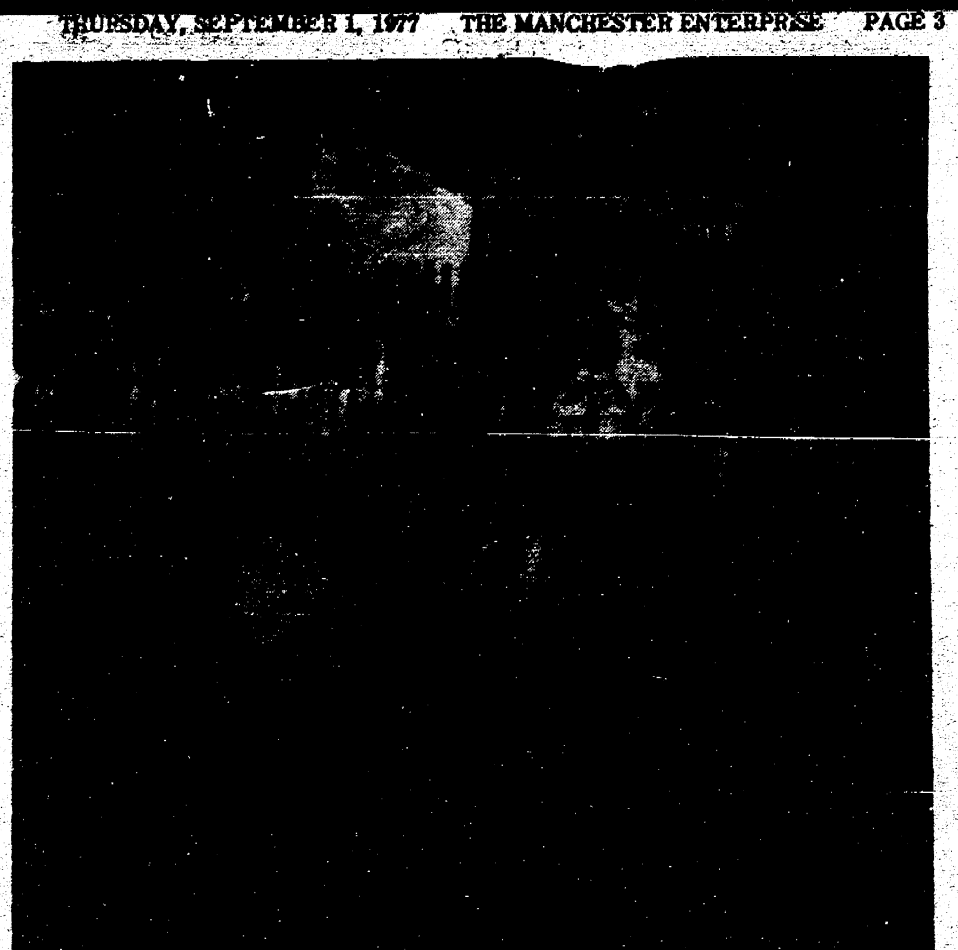

UPROAR OVER CHEMICALS

The FDA is on the march to ban low-level use of penicillin and several other important drugs in animal feeds—drugs used to keep animals healthy. Some consumer groups are cheering, but farmers and ranchers—the nation's food producers—are sure it would be an expensive mistake.

The food producers are right. Scientists have assembled a kind of economic impact statement, the economics of banning the use of all farm chemicals, the banning of fertilizers, pesticides, drugs—the works. Their conclusion was that crop and livestock production would drop by as much as one-third in two to three years.

Not only would we have one-third less food to start with, if we also banned pesticides and fumigants used to keep the bugs and mice out of food transporting trucks, rail cars, and airplanes, and out of food processing factories, warehouses and stores—and if we banned the use of chemical food preservatives, even less food would make it to the consumer. Food prices would go up as consumers

bid to get their fair share of that much smaller food supply.

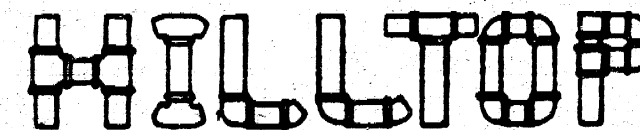
Ellen Zawall, a prominent spokesman for the consumer movement, noted that when a group she chaired—a group investigating the feasibility of banning nitrates (nitrates are used in bacon, hams, and other cured meat products to kill botulism and bacteria) that such a ban would have a 10 to 15 per cent inflationary impact on the total market basket. Said Ms. Zawall: "It becomes increasingly evident that deciding issues of public health and safety are more complex than one can imagine." Farmers agree.

Even though school buses have proven to be a reliable and safe method of travel, the traffic safety dangers involved in transporting one million students 125 million miles this school year in Michigan are considerable, according to Automobile Club of Michigan.

"Since school-aged children are unpredictable and impulsive, it is important that motorists be extra alert, especially for the 160,000 students starting kindergarten this September," said Arthur C.

Gibson, Auto Club's Safety and Traffic Engineering manager.

"About 40 percent of the state's 2.5 million students in grades kindergarten through 12 ride buses to class," pointed out Gibson, who urged motorists, including school bus drivers, to drive cautiously and reduce their speed in school areas.

Through its "School's Open--Drive Carefully" campaign, now in its 31st year, Auto Club promotes the importance of

none, walk facing traffic on the shoulder of the road.

*Watch for turning cars and never cross between parked vehicles.

*Leave home in plenty of time to arrive at the bus stop and stay well off the roadway while waiting to be picked up.

*Remain seated while the bus is moving and keep hands and arms inside at all times.

*After leaving the bus, walk at least 10 steps ahead of it before crossing the road, waiting for the driver to signal it is safe. Never cross at the back of the bus.

Motorists are reminded to be extra cautious when seeing a bus in the distance since children running to catch it sometimes forget to look before crossing roadways. Drivers also should stop at least 10 feet in front or in back of a bus when it is picking up or dropping off children on any road without barriers or dividers between lanes. That is a state law.

Auto Club warned that rear-end collisions occur too frequently because drivers realize too late that vehicles in front of them have stopped for school buses.

The presence of a school bus should be a warning to motorists that traffic may come to a stop and they should be prepared to take similar action.

Gibson recalled one tragic accident in which a 6-year-old youngster was killed last year when he crossed in front of a school bus and was struck by a car that failed to stop for the flashing red lights of the bus.

Auto Club suggests that parents teach children these simple rules for riding the bus or walking to school:

*Walk only on the sidewalk. If there is

CAN WE HELP PAY YOUR RENT?

The Michigan State Housing Development Authority (MSHDA) and the Michigan Department of Social Services (DSS) have begun operating a new program, known as the Section B Rent Allowance Program, which will be available to 72 families in Washtenaw County. Section B provides money to help people pay their rent. The part of the rent you pay each month will be determined by your family's income and the number of people in your family. However, the amount you pay each month for rent, heat, and utilities will not be more than 25% of your adjusted monthly income.

A family accepted for the program may remain in their present home or seek new housing, but to meet program requirements, the housing unit must be inspected by DSS and found to be safe, decent and sanitary. In addition, your rent must not be higher than HUD approved Fair Market Rent limits.

Eligible tenants will be selected on a first-come, first-served basis. Applications will be accepted beginning August 22, 1977 at the Washtenaw County Department of Social Services.

CAN WE HELP YOU FILL VACANT UNITS?

The Michigan State Housing Development Authority (MSHDA) and the Michigan Department of Social Services (DSS) have begun operating a new program known as the Section B Rent Allowance Program. The Section B Program will be administered through the County DSS office. Section B is a federally funded program which provides money to help tenants pay their rent. Tenants who participate in the program will have part of their rent paid directly to the landlord by MSHDA.

In order for a housing unit to qualify, the rent, including utilities must be within the HUD Fair Market Rents. In addition, the unit must be safe, decent, and sanitary. FEATURES FOR OWNERS/MANAGERS: * The MSHDA portion of the rent is automatically sent to the landlord at the first of each month.

* Tenants currently leasing units may receive a rent allowance if both the unit and the tenant meet eligibility criteria. * Income limits for eligibility are set at levels which permit moderate income families and low income families to participate.

* Landlords select tenants according to their own guidelines. However, no violation of the nondiscrimination requirements of Fair Housing Laws will be allowed. * Landlords receive 50% of the monthly rent for up to 90 days if a tenant vacates in violation of the lease. * The program provides for annual rent adjustments.
