

Remember the old philosophy--innocent until proven guilty? Today, it seems, public attitude has changed to--Guilty until innocent, through inquisition.

Farmer cooperatives, which have been around since the early 1800's, have had their turn in the "accuseds' box," and even though proven innocent, still bear the sears of public misunderstanding. In the frustrated consumer search for the illusive culprit that was causing increased food prices, farmer cooperatives were summoned to the witness stand as a suspect. They were BIG; therefore, they must

They were big, but what the public forgot was that they were made up of many small farmers, some of whom could not survive, in this world of economic implexity, without their cooperatives. Groups of farmers, united through a cooperative. figure importantly in maintaining the family farm by combining efficiency in producing a commodity, with efficiency in processing and marketing it. This efficiency benefits the consumer as well as the farmer.

Perhaps cooperatives were not as accressive as they should have been in sharing this economic fact of life with consumers, and their image was slightly tarnished by the public attacks on their

system. They've been working to corre public misunderstanding, but a sma article extolling the benefits of operatives does not make the impact public opinion that a Sylvia Porter sy dicated attack does.

Students Earn Outstanding Achievement

Principal John Korican announced today that two students at Manchester High in the Merit Scholarship competition, but School have achieved outstanding achievement in the 23rd annual National Merit Scholarship Program. These honors are the result of each student's outstanding performance on the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT/NMSQT) which stitutions selected by the student. was administered nationwide to high school juniors in October, 1976. John Munson son of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Munson, of 9981 Bethel Church Road was selected as a National Merit Semi-finalist. A letter of Commendation was presented to Doug Wilson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Howard Wilson, of 14950 Buss Road.

Semi-finalists are the students who scored highest in their respective states, and they represent less than one-half of one percent of each state's secondary school seniors. Students selected for the commended student group represent less than two percent of the total of graduating U.S. secondary school seniors.

Only semi-finalists named in the fall of 1977 can advance to the finalist standing and be considered for Merit Scholarships to be awarded in 1978. These are \$250 to \$1500 scholarships. To become finalists, semi-finalists must meet further requirements established for the competition that include being fully endorsed and recommended for scholarships by their principals, presenting school cords that confirm high academic standing, and substantiating their PSAT/NMSQT scores with an equivalent performance on the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT).

MANCHESTER VILLAGE ORDINANCE NO. 100

CONTROL THE ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR TRAFFIC WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF MANCHESTERY AND TO PROVIDE PEN-ALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

The Village of Manchester ordains:

Section 1. That for the purpose of this rdinance "alcoholic liquor" shall be construed to include any spirituous, vinous. malt, or fermented liquer, liquids and compounds, whether or not medicated. proprietary, patented, and by whatever names called, containing one-half (1/2) of one percent (1%) or more of alcohol by colume which are fit for use for beverage purposes.

"Beer" is herby defined and construed to mean any beverage obtained by alcoholic fermentation of an infusion or decoction of barley, malt, hops, and/or other cereal in potable water.

"Wine" is hereby defined and construed to mean the product made by the normal alcoholic fermentation of the juice of sound, ripe grapes, or any other fruit with the usual cellar treatment and containing not more than sixteen per cent (16%) of alcohol by volume. It shall also include fermented fruit juices other than grapes.

"Spirits" are hereby defined and construed to mean any beverages containing alcohol by distillation, mixed with potable water and other substances in solution, and includes, among other things, wine containing an alcoholic content of over sixteen per cent (16%) by volume.

"Person" shall be construed to mean any person, firm, partnership, associatien, or corporation.

Section 2. No person shall engage in the business of selling alcoholic liquor in the Village of Manchester without first obtaining a license therefor, as required by the statutes of the State of Michigan.

Section 3. No person shall sell beer and/or wine, and/or spirits for consumption on the premises within the Village of Manchester without having obtained the approval of the Common Council of said Village to application for a license so to seil, as required by the statutes of the

State of Michigan. Section 4. No person, either directly or indirectly, by himself, clerk, agent, servant, or employee, shall at any time, within the Village of Manchester, sell, furnish, give or deliver any alcoholic liquor to any person unless such person shall have a attained the age of eighteen (18) years; nor shall any person, either directly or indirectly by himself, clerk, agent, servant, or employee, at any time, sell, furnish, give or deliver any alcoholic liquor to any person who is too intoxicated as not to be in control of all of his faculties.

No person under the age of eighteen (18) years shall at any time purchase, offer or attempt to purchase, obtain, consume, or bring unto any premises within the Village of Manchester, for which a license has been issued to sell intoxicating liquor on the premises, any alcoholic liquor as defined by this ordinance. Nor shall any person in order to procure the sale and furnishing of alcoholic liquor to any person under the age of eighteen (18) years, make any false representations as to the age of the person for whom said alcoholic liquor is desired. Nor shall any person under the age of eighteen (18) years furnish any false information regarding his or her age or make any false representations as to his or her age to any law enforcement officer, or to any person in charge of or employed in a place of business where alcoholic liquor is sold, for the purpose of obtaining a sale of any alcoholic liquor to himself or herself.

Section 5. No person shall permit spirits to be consumed in any place or on any premises owned, operated or controlled by him, and licensed under the laws of the State of Michigan to sell beer, and/or wine, and not licensed to sell spirits. Section 6. No person, either directly or indirectly, by himself, his agent, servant, or employee, shall within the Village

of Manchester sell, give away, furnish,

the premises owned, operated or controlled

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE AND by him and for which a license has been granted by the State of Michigan, any alcoholic liquor between the hours of two (2:00) o'clock A.M. and seven (7) o'clock A.M. of each day; provided, however, that during the night of December 31 and the morning of January 1, such liquor may be sold or otherwise furnished during the entire period permitted by the Statutes of the State or regulations adopted pursugar thereto.

> Section 7. No gambling shall be permitted in any premises wherein alcoholic liquors are sold for consumption on said premises within the Village of Manchester. No dancing or floor shows shall be permitted within the Village of Manchester on any premises for which a license has been issued for the sale of alcoholic liquors, unless permitted by the Statutes of the Siste of Michigan and regulations adopted persuant thereto. These restrictions however, shall not prevent the sale of spirits by the glass for consumption on the premises, dancing, or the furnishing of musical entertainment by means of an orehestra or floor shows on a premises operated by an existing fraternal or penevolege society, or by any club which at the date hereof has a license permitting the sale of spirits by the glass, issued by the Liquor Control Commission. or by any organization, national in character, not connected or functioning with an educational institution

Section 8. No person having the management, ownership, or control of any premises in the Village of Manchester, wherein leoholic liquors are sold for consumption on said premises, shall permit by talking, laughing, boisterous conduct, or in any other manner, the disturbance of the peace and good order of the neighborhood; nor shall any person or persons. frequenting such premises, wherein alcobolic liquors are sold for consumption on the premises, make or assist in making any noise, disturbance, or improper diversion, by which the peace and good order of the neighborhood is disturbed.

Section 9. No alcoholic liquor shall be consumed on the public streets, parks or in any other public places (unless a permit therefore is secured as shall be established by appropriate resolution adopted by the Village Council) including any store or establishment doing business with the public including areas thereof provided for the parking of motor vehicles, inthe Village of Manchester, not licensed to sell such alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises; nor shall anyone who owns, operates, or controls any such public establishment or store permit the consumption of alcoholic liquor thereon, without first having obtained a license therefor.

Section 10. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00) and costs of prosecution or by Jail, not to exceed ninety (90) days or both and that upon the imposition of any such fine, the Court shall have the power and authority to make a further order or judgement that such person so convicted shall be imprisoned in the county jai until such fine and costs shall be paid, but such imprisonment shall not exceed ninety (90) days.

Section 11. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after twenty (20) days after adoption and shall be published in the Manchester Enterprise within fifteen (15) days after its passage.
