10 Years Ago

Kirk
Sunday, I was talking to Clayton Parr. I asked him how many storms he remembered that were worse than the one this week, he reminded me that on January 17, 1918, a storm and high winds brought in about 6 inches of snow, then on the evening of January 27, 1918, another storm with high winds arrived. That evening Mrs. F.J. Kirk, decided to have a baby, Doctor L.C. Kent, a new young dedicated country doctor who had moved here from an Upper Peninsula practice was called. He agreed to come with Eleanor Gumper, a practical nurse volunteer. They spent all night getting there. Their cutter had turned over 3 times before reaching the Fred Grossman farm, 1 1/2 mile North. They left the horse and car and walked the rest of the way. The new arrival was the present postmaster, Marvin J. Kirk. The middle of the next day, after the delivery, the doctor reached in his overcoat pockets, there was still snow in them.

Just North of the house was the Zimmerman School, with a high bank and orchard on the other side of the road, a snow bank went from the orchard to the school steps. F.J. Kirk with horses and sled

drove through this on April 17. From January 28, till April 17, the farmers traveled up the bank on west side of road, to school ground, then near school steps to Mahrle Rd., to the Fred Grossman farm, through his field, back of his barn then back onto road to the corner of the Higgins and Weinlander Orchard, across the orchard to Spike's Gas Station.

Ed Dresselhouse told me, that was the only Saturday night his store and all others in his 44 years of business was not open.

I was listening to the Adrian Radio Station today, as a man remembered this storm and stated, the people cut fences and crossed farms all winter, and not one farmer complained about cut fences. The snow was frozen hard enough to walk on top of it, you did not sink in, many of the younger people skated on top of the snow, going over the fence tops.

ESSAY CONTEST
Thousands of Michigan junior high students will be competing in the Sixth Annual Michigan Law Day Essay Contest with the theme, "The Law: Your Access to Justice," between now and entry deadline, March 4 at midnight.

Prizes of \$100, \$75, \$50 and \$25 U.S. Savings Bonds will be awarded in each of the seventh, eighth and ninth grade categories. All seventh, eighth and ninth grade students in public, private and parochial schools in Michigan are eligible.

Entries in the contest consisting of 300 words or less, must be postmarked no later than midnight, March 4, 1978, reports Mrs. Sharon Wilson of Lansing, Chairperson of Law Day activities for the Lawyers Wives of Michigan, joint sponsor of the statewide contest with the State Bar of Michigan. The Bar's Law Day Committee is chaired by Phyllis D. Greenowood of Lansing and Duncan M. Beagle of Flint.

In announcing the contest, Chairperson Wilson stated, "As today's youths are our tomorrow's America we are delighted to sponsor this essay contest aimed at stimulating their thoughts towards tomorrow's decisions."

Criteria for judging the essays is: (1) content, (2) originality, (3) sincerity of thought, (4) clarity of expression, (5) accuracy of information and (6) ability to follow directions of the contest.

The 12 winners of the essay contest, their parents and teacher will be honored at a special ceremony on Monday, May 1 in Lansing.

commercial vehicles, pickup trucks and trailers the mail deadline is February 1. Austin, who initiated the license-by-mail program after taking office, is a firm believer in doing it the "early, easy" way.

"Buying by mail is so simple and expedient that I don't know why more persons don't avail themselves of this convenient method of obtaining their tabs," Austin said.

"All a vehicle owner has to do is sign the prepared application sent to him by mail and send both parts of it in with a personal check or money order made payable to the State of Michigan to: License Plate Tabs, Lansing, Michigan 48980."

If you find it more convenient to visit a Secretary of State branch office, they are located within short driving distances of most Michigan areas, Austin said.

For persons who wish to obtain their tabs at a branch office, it is necessary to have the prepared application, proof of no-fault insurance, and, of course, money to complete the transaction. Personal checks and money orders are not only accepted but encouraged. Persons without prepared applications must fill out one at a branch office and must also produce a certificate of title or last year's registration certificate.
