the old iron bridge that spanned the river at the site of the present bridge was an old style affair that vibrated and over it on the way to Hoffer's Mill, at that exists today.

We soon found out that Saturday night on Exchange Place was where you met your friends each week. It was a busy place. The local stores catered to every need of those from the surrounding territory and Saturday was the day to come to town. Farm autos and wagons lined the streets in the evening and all the stores remained open until almost 11:00 p.m., or until the customers were all served and had departed for home.

At that time the present Austin Road was a State highway, designated as M-11. lowever, it was unpaved from Napoleon to Saline but the State Highway Department had promised to replace the shaky iron bridge with a modern affair. Construction on it, however, did not begin until the following spring.

had charge of the freight house adjacent to the depot which stood on the East side of the road just East of the present food market on West Main Street. In those days freight delivered by truck was somewhat of a rarity and Mr. Kirk and his pickup picked up much of the freight for the various stores after it had been unloaded from the trains at the freight house and delivered it to the various

After it had been discussed for some time Jim, with a sly grin on his face turned to the group and said, "I know where the increase came from. It's because of that morning train that the railroad put on some six years ago. It comes through town whistling for every crossing at the ungodly hour of five fifty."
