How to make the Lace Edge Ribbon Wreath Illustrated on page 16

- Materials needed:**
- 72-in. styrofoam ring
 - 4-yds. No. 40 red Gingham Lace Edge Ribbon
 - 1-yd. No. 40 red Velvet Lace Edge Ribbon
 - 1-yd. No. 40 red Velvet Ribbon
 - 1 white chenille stem
 - Stapler, glue (Optional)
- Instructions:**
1. Glue or pin the red #8 ribbon around outside of ring.
 2. Cut the No. 40 gingham and No. 40 velvet lace edge into 7-in. lengths. For each piece, fold in half, end to end, right side out. Hold ends together, slide a tack in the center and staple it. Pin to ring, one at a time, with two pins. Do inside of ring first. Pin at edge pointing to inside. Inside row uses 5 pieces of each ribbon.
 3. Repeat for outside ring. Pin at edge, overlapping to hide pins. Outside row takes 8 pieces on each ribbon.
 4. Now do the middle of ring. Follow curve of ring using 7 pieces of each ribbon.
 5. Cut a 3-in. piece of chenille stem and shape into a "U". Push into back of ring for hanger.

**Cancer Society
Super-Thon**

Washtenaw County is gearing up to its

first Super-Thon for the American Cancer Society. Presented by the Chelsea Jaycees and Auxiliary, it is scheduled Sunday, September 28th at the Chrysler Proving Grounds with a goal of \$30,000.00 in mind.

The Super-Thon involves a 20 mile bike route or a choice of a 5 or a 10 mile running course. It is open to all bicyclists and runners. Participants must obtain minimum total pledges of \$10.00 to enter.

Actually a fifth year event, only a bike-a-thon has been held in years past. But with the hope of increasing participation and funds raised, running courses have been added to the program.

The Chrysler Proving Grounds, located two miles south of Chelsea on M-52, is an ideal place to hold the Super-Thon. It features miles of scenic paved country roads and rolling hills. And unlike other area events, participants won't have to contend with motorists. The only motor vehicles allowed on the courses will be the "Sag Wagon" which will be used to assist weary participants and a tour bus for those who are not participating but want to view the course.

The absence of motor vehicles makes the event completely safe for any age. Over the past years entrants have ranged from under 2 years old to senior citizens. Also, participants will receive constant supervision from Chrysler employees who man the check points along the routes. Parents can relax and let the children join in, making the day a family affair.

Top Money Raisers will receive prizes ranging from a 10 speed bike to a pair of running shoes to a \$10.00 gift certificate. Every participant who turns in his or her money on or before Monday, October 15th will qualify for the Grand Prize drawing which is a Schwinn or Raleigh bike. Prizes have been donated from area merchants. All participants will receive a Super-Thon 1980 Patch.

Proceeds from the Super-Thon will go for the benefit of the Washtenaw County Unit of the American Cancer Society. Many people are living proof that cancer can be beat but constant and continued support is imperative to on-going research. This county project has been very successful in raising funds for cancer research. Last year it yielded 280 participants and \$13,000.00.

TAXES, TAXES, TAXES

We all pay them...when we buy something, when we get our paycheck, or when the IRS catches up with us.

And, on January 1 of next year, there will be some more new taxes. Social Security taxes will increase to the tune of 16 billion dollars. The Windfall Profits Tax is expected to collect 15 billion. But politicians don't think that way. They want to cut taxes to make themselves popular, so they will get elected. And after the election, they can blame the nation's economic woes on someone else. Meanwhile, it's you and I who lose. Because inflation is just that much higher than before, and our dollars don't go as far.

And these politicians who do this to us...know where their paychecks come from? Right! Our tax dollars.
