Most seed packages say to plant when all danger of frost is over. In Michigan that can be most any time. We have no idea when that

The smart thing to do is to plant your seedlings indoors and then transplant them outdoors after all danger of frost is over. They should be grown where they are exposed to sunlight which in Michigan is during February and March.

The bathroom is a fine humid place to grow them but there is liable to be objections on the part of your better half, so take them to the basement and install fluorescent lights at considerable

You should start the seedlings about six weeks before there is any frost danger, whenever that

All gardens have pests. They wander over from their gardens next door, sneer at your crooked rows, chuckle at your anemic seedlings and peer at your unpulled weeds and ask "Whatcher growing, a new kind of

not so noisy. Plants that are not crops are weeds. One way to tell them is that they are the only thing in your garden that are growing. If allowed to grow they will kill what remains of your crops and attract pests. If you wait until midsummer to plant, weeds won't grow very fast-

neither will the crops. Just make

sure it is after all danger of frost. Surround your growing crops with muleh which tis said is derived from rotting things in the German language. Some gardners use old newspapers for mulch which works nicely until the first rain or high wind. Garden shops however, will sell you mulch for about \$3.60 a bale with the promise that it will keep the weeds down. For a somewhat larger amount the same fellow will sell you the Brooklyn Bridge.

It is quite difficult to tell the flowers from the weeds but if you use straw for mulch you will get hands full of the stuff every time you pull up the weeds that grow through but if the wind is right just toss handfulls up in the air in the direction of the pest's garden next door and chuckle loudly.

Simmer until vegetables are tender, then puree. Return to saucepan, heat to boiling, stir in one cup heavy cream. Heat, but do not boil, before serving.



Nuclear Power paying off for the man who saw energy's future.

Aaron Brookhouse is happy that he had a good vision of the future.

For 27 years he has helped make the electricity that lights Michigan's homes and powers its industries. From his early jobs in traditional generating plants, he watched Michigan's first commerical nuclear power plant, Big Rock Point, guide the state into the nuclear age in 1982. Then, in the late 1960's, con-

struction of the Palisades Nuclear Plant began near South Haven. Brookhouse realized that the electric utility industry was poised for a major thrust into the nuclear era. He wanted to be a part of it.

"I had the feeling that nuclear power was the coming thing, that everybody would be going this way," says Brookhouse. "I wanted to get in on the ground floor."

He did, and he isn't sorry. Brookhouse, then in his mid-

30s, went through an intensive training program and earned a nuclear reactor operator's license. When Palisades generated its first electricity in 1971 he was there, working as a shift supervisor of other reactor operators. He has been at Palisades ever since.

Brookhouse and others like him have helped nurse the plant present state; early in 1983 the Nuclear Regulatory Commission said Palisades had the most improved regulatory performance of any nuclear plant in the Midwest.

He and his fellow workers are proud of that, and of their role in the nuclear power industry. But he's bothered by what he calls a small, uninformed minority who are critical of the power source.

"I think that those who know enough about nuclear power generally are for it," Brookhouse says. "If the rest had more contact with it, or were more familiar with it, they also would support it. "Nuclear power is safe for



those who work with it, and for everyone else. I only live 10 miles down the road, and I feel very comfortable about it."

A nuclear plant is so carefully designed and has so many backup systems that any imaginable problem can be handled, he says. He adds that the people who run the plant also are well prepared.

Brookhouse points out that it takes a lot of work and study to earn a reactor operator's license. which is required to work in the plant's control room. The training is capped by a 61/2-hour written test, followed by a rigorous oral through its early years to its operator, Brookhouse had even more training and more extensive testing.

To stay qualified and keep abreast of the ever-advancing technology, operators spend more than 10 percent of each year in the classroom for further training. They also are re-tested each year.

Brookhouse, now 50, says his long-ago feeling about the importance of nuclear power was right on target And he's convinced it will stay that way.




